Copy of A Circular Letter - Our General afsembly have adjourn'd for a Thort time to consult their constituenty whether an humble Addrefs should be drawn up and transmitted to his Majisty, praying that he would be pleased to take this Province under his immeadiate protection and Government; That is, whether the Treemen of this Province should petition the Ring that we may be reduced to the Torm of a Ring's Governme The resbyterians here, upon mature delebiration are of Opinion, that it is not safe to do things of Such importance Rashby Our priviledgy by these means may be greatly Abridged, but will never be enlarged - We are under the Things Frotection & government now as much as we can be, for he will never govern us in prerson; and it is af no great consequence whether his Deputy [be recommended] by the proprietaries or by some other great man by his Majesty's Approbation Our Charter is in danger bysuch a change and let no man persuade you to the contrarg, There has been a half yearly meeting of the Quakers in this; City, but this change of Government; has not been prosed in their Meeting as we can yet understand, nor is it approved of by the head of that Society This affair is in all probability a Trap laid to ensnare the unwarg and then to castan Odiam on the Prisbyteriary for Ruining or altempting to Muin the Province.
