

Princeton N. Jersey Sept 20. 1746

D^r Sir,

When I first began to write that which I now call
An Appendix to the Journal, I had no Thoughts of its
being half so large, nor of so particularly distinguishing
it from the Journal by the Name of an Appendix:
and therefore made an Introduction accordingly, by saying,
I should now conclude the present Journal, but that I
calling it virtually a Part of the Journal, but as I have
made it a distinct Appendix in the Title Page, I entreat
you to begin it thus, I should have concluded what I had
at present to offer upon the Affairs respecting my Mission,
with the preceding Account of the Money collected and
expended for the religious Interests of the Indians, but
that &c.

And being you have not as yet printed the Title Page
of the first Part of the Journal, I desire that you would
be pleas'd to transpose the two first Verses of Scripture
there quoted, i. e. Let that in the 55 of Isaiah stand 13 verse
stand first, and let that in the 65, and 5th Succeed.

I likewise desire, that Instead of the last Passage of Scripture
quoted in the Title Page of the second Part of the Journal,
vers. Ps 100. 3. you would be pleas'd to insert that in Psal.
118. 23. This is the Lords Doing, it is marvellous in our
Eyes.

As the first Particular here mentioned viz, the Beginning of
the Appendix, is of some considerable Importance, so I trust
you will take special Care that it be not neglected.
