

PRELIMINARY NOTICE.

UNDER the auspices and control of the reunited Presbyterian Church, the Board of Publication entered upon a new stage of its noble work. It presented to the Church a consolidated list embracing a mass of Presbyterian, Calvinistic and Evangelical literature of which, if it is improper to say that it may well be proud, it is at least due to truth to say that it is a catalogue for which to be profoundly grateful. It has been voluntarily asserted by eminent scholars of other lands that nowhere in the world can be found its parallel in wealth for the Calvinistic Christian.

"The Presbyterian Board of Publication" of one branch of the Church went into operation in the year 1838, and after surmounting the difficulties of its early years steadily advanced in power for good and in the number of its publications. The "Presbyterian Publication Committee" of the other branch commenced its course at a later period. It was organized as a "Doctrinal Tract Committee" in 1852, and after its early struggles for life were surmounted attained to the style of "The Presbyterian Publication Committee" in 1855, yet was compelled to wait for a suitable working capital some years longer. After attaining a fair financial footing, it also made rapid advances in the use of the printed page in the service of the Church.

The Catalogue of the united Board was not only large, but was also rich in its variety, and since the reunion has received many and valuable additions. Its publications range all the way from the Child's Primer, with its A B C's, up to Calvin's Institutes.

In the department of Theology the Calvinist will here find, in addition to the Institutes and the Letters of Calvin himself, works by Owen, Fisher, Hodge, Dickinson and others, with a whole armory of Tracts explaining and defending the tenets of the system.

The Presbyterian too will be able here to secure expositions and defences of the peculiarities of the faith and order of his venerable Church, with polemic treatises upon points which he maintains to be scriptural and true, though controverted by those who hold to prelacy, exclusive immersion, close communion, independency, etc. Here too will he find the Histories of the Presbyterian Church, the Digests of its acts and deliverances, its "Book," with its Confession of Faith and Form of Government and Directory of Worship.

The pastor can draw from its list aids for his own instruction and, to a higher degree, helps for his work. Commentaries and Concordances, Hymnals, books to arouse the impenitent, to instruct the inquirer, to educate the convert, stand ready for his use in feeding the flock, in edifying the Church of Christ.

Hither the Sabbath-school teacher may come for helps in his important field of labor. Commentaries, Question Books, Lesson Papers and the many "requisites" for the Sabbath-school are, and still more largely will be, at his command. Nor have the scholars been overlooked. The command of the Master, "Feed my lambs," is one to which diligent heed has been given. A whole library of volumes for the Sabbathschool is published by the Board, which, without claiming absolute perfection, challenges examination and comparison with the list of any publishing-house in the world. These books range comprehensively from the little book for the infant scholar up to the goodly volumes adapted to the reading of the members of our highest Bible classes. Of Primers, Readers and Catechisms there will be found no lack: of the last especially the variety is great. If the Westminster Shorter Catechism and the Confession of Faith are not studied, it will not be because they are not furnished by the Board of Publication in shapes to suit all tastes.

Nor will the earnest Christian or the lover of deep Christian experience be disappointed in the study of this list. The rich thoughts of former generations are here conserved in the works of Baxter, Bunyan, Davies, Matthew Henry, Owen, Mead, whilst of more modern date the "Religious Experience" of Archibald Alexander, the "Daily Meditations" of George Bowen, the Biographies of McCheyne, Alexander, Walter M. Lowrie, Mrs. Sherwood, Samuel A. Rhea and many others of similar spirit will stimulate and feed the soul that hungers and thirsts after righteousness.

The bereaved, the anxious, the tempted, have not been forgotten, nor has the stranger within our gates been neglected. For our manytongued people of America, as well as for foreign nations, much has been done, and more will be done if Providence permit. Books and tracts are now circulated by the Board in French, German, Spanish, Portuguese and Welsh.

Whilst rejoicing in what has been accomplished in the past, the Board of Publication looks forward to a larger, broader, deeper work in the future. In every department of church effort and church instruction it desires and hopes to furnish what will meet the demands not only, but the true wants, of its constituency. With the blessing of God this hope may be fulfilled.

An excellent little manual for a sick chamber.

Destruction of Jerusalem.

No. 29.

The destruction of Jerusalem an irresistible proof of the divine origin of Christianity. 18mo. (S. S. Lib.)

It is impossible to read this treatise without being struck by the proof which it affords of the truth of Christianity. The predictions of Christ in relation to the overthrow and final destruction of Jerusalem were so minutely fulfilled, that the conviction cannot be resisted that he was the Great Prophet.

Christian's Great Interest.

No. 30.

The Christian's Great Interest; or, The Trial of a Saving Interest in Christ, and the Way to Attain It. By the Rev. WILLIAM GUTHRIE, minister at New Kilmarnock, Scotland, 1605. With an Introductory Essay by the Rev. THOMAS CHALMERS, D. D. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

This little work is one of the number which used to circulate from cottage to cottage among Scottish Presbyterians. Although the style is old, the matter is so rich as amply to reward a perusal.

Life of Andrew Melville.

This judicious abridgment will be read with ease and pleasure, particularly by the young.

Lives of the Patriarchs.

The Lives of the Patriarchs. 18mo. (S. S. Lib.)

This is a book designed chiefly for Sabbath-school scholars, and is well adapted to secure attention and inform the mind.

Flavel on Antinomianism.

No. 34.

A Blow at the Root of Antinomianism. By the Rev. JOHN FLAVEL. 32mo. (Cong. Lib.)

A capital refutation of the odious doctrine that believers are freed from the moral law as a rule of life.

Fulfilling of the Scripture.

No. 35.

The Fulfilling of the Scriptures, for confirming believers and convincing unbelievers. By the Rev. ROBERT FLEMING. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

One of the rare instances of an abridgment better than the original.

Lime-Street Lectures.

No. 36.

The Lime-Street Lectures. A defence of the important doctrines of the gospel in twenty-six sermons. By several eminent divines. 8vo. (Min. Lib.)

The Lime-Street Lectures have long been regarded as a standard work on Calvinistic theology. They have different degrees of merit, and yet are all characterized by forcible arguments in the illustration and enforcement of the great doctrines of grace.

Dr. Goodwin was one of the most learned and laborious of the non-conformists. He died in London in 1679. This treatise is a beautiful illustration of Psalm lxxxv. 8.

Sketches of Church History. Comprising a regular series of the most important and interesting events in the History of the Church from the birth of Christ to the nineteenth century. By the Rev. James Wharey. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

A succinct but very satisfactory sketch of events in ecclesiastical history; particularly suited to those who have not the opportunity of perusing larger histories.

Lives of Owen and Janeway.

The biographer has succeeded in giving a very pleasing portraiture of this truly excellent man, who held so prominent a place in the Church in the day in which he lived, and has interspersed his narrative with sketches of character and historical events of great interest.

Mystery of Providence.

Flavel has a charm which is peculiar to himself even among the Puritans. He presents his important teachings in a manner so pleasant and fascinating that we never lay down his works without wondering how we could be so long absent from them.

Memoir of W. T. Buchanan.

Memoir of the last illness and death of William Tharp Buchanan, Esq., of Ilfracombe. By the late WILLIAM SHEPHERD, Esq., of Ilfracombe, Devon. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

Mr. Buchanan died in his youth, and a peculiar interest is thrown about his character from the circumstance that grace converted him from being a skeptic into a humble follower of the Lamb.

Miller on Ruling Elders.

The Constitutional History of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America. By the Rev. Charles Hodge, D. D., Professor in the Theological Seminary at Princeton. Two volumes bound in one. 8vo. (Min. Lib.)

This work should find a place in the library, not only of every minister, but of every Presbyterian family. As an authentic history of our Church to the year 1788, it is invaluable.

Laborers in the East.

Laborers in the East; or, Memoirs of Eminent Men who were Devoted to the Service of Christ in India. Containing abridged biographies of the Rev. Dr. Buchanan, the Rev. Henry Martyn and the Rev. David Brown. With an engraving. 18mo. (S. S. Lib.)

A charming little book, in which the examples of three eminently pious servants of Christ are set forth in so attractive a manner as can scarcely fail to awaken the desire to go and do likewise.

Œcolampadius, a sketch of whose life is appended, was the worthy, pious, learned and efficient coadjutor of Zuinglius.

These records of the self-denying efforts of the Moravian Missionaries in Greenland, Labrador, Asiatic Russia and Siberia possess deep interest for the religious reader who wishes to note the progress of true religion. Young readers will be attracted by the incidents, which are often of the most exciting nature, and the oldest Christians might learn a lesson of patience and faith in the humble piety and uncomplaining endurance of the servants of God whose labors are here recorded.

Scott's Force of Truth.

The Force of Truth. An authentic narrative. By the Rev. Thomas Scott, D. D. With a Recommendatory Letter by the Rev. Samuel Miller, D. D.; to which are added eight letters addressed to Dr. Scott by the Rev. John Newton. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

Records of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America. Embracing the Minutes of the Presbytery of Philadelphia from A. D. 1706 to 1716; Minutes of the Synod of Philadelphia from A. D. 1717 to 1758; Minutes of the Synod of New York from A. D. 1745 to 1758; Minutes of the Synod of New York and Philadelphia from A. D. 1758 to 1788. Prepared by the Rev. Wm. M. Engles, D. D. 8vo. (Min. Lib.)

In this volume the early records of the Church are permanently preserved; and although the work consists of the Minutes of ecclesiastical bodies, yet it furnishes much valuable information of the early history of the Church. No Presbyterian clergyman should consider his library complete without this volume.

Religious Experience.

No. 74.

Thoughts on Religious Experience. By the Rev. Archibald Alexander, D. D., late Professor in the Princeton Theological Seminary. 16mo. (Cong. Lib.)

These views of experimental religion possess much value. The high estimation in which they are held may be judged from the fact that, when many of them were first published in a religious newspaper, they were most extensively copied by papers of different denominations in various parts of the country. They are written in a plain and familiar style, and are pervaded by the kindly and amiable spirit of the author. The volume, which has just been re-stereotyped (1870), is a neat one, and is adorned by a portrait of the author expressly engraved for this work.

The Covenanters.

History of the Covenanters in Scotland. By the author of the History of the Reformation, etc. 2 vols. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

Presbyterians should make themselves acquainted with the prelatic persecutions of their Scottish forefathers during the reigns of Charles I. and Charles II., who were alike tyrants of the worst grade. The patient endurance, the uncompromising principle and the unaffected piety of these men, however caricatured by novelists and misrepresented by interested historians, will be perpetuated as an instructive example to remote generations. These two volumes embrace the material facts and narratives of much larger histories.

Synod of Dort.

The Articles of the Synod of Dort. Translated from the Latin. With Notes by the Rev. Thomas Scott, D. D. To which is added an Introductory Essay by the Rev. Samuel Miller, D. D. 12mo. (Min. Lib.)

Next to the Westminster Assembly of divines, there have been few ecclesiastical bodies whose history is more interesting than that of the Synod of Dort. It is essential to a full understanding of the controversy between Calvinism and Arminianism. This account, translated by Scott, is the best and most authentic, and it is enriched by the introductory chapter by the Rev. Dr. Miller.

This is eminently a practical treatise, in which the pious writer, in a series of familiar letters, obviates the objections which arise in the carnal mind to the religion of the gospel, and leads the inquirer to an intelligent reception of the truth as it is in Jesus. It is particularly appropriate for the relief of those who are troubled with skeptical doubts.

Historical facts and incidents and Oriental customs and manners are here made to throw light upon the Scripture, as well as confirm its truth.

Lectures on the Shorter Catechism of the Presbyterian Church in the United States of America. Addressed to youth. By the Rev. ASHBEL GREEN, D. D. With a beautiful likeness of the author. 2 vols. 12mo. (Min. Lib.)

Coogle

A condensed and yet satisfactory illustration of the doctrines of the Presbyterian Church. Founded on the Westminster Assembly's Shorter Catechism, it brings every point distinctly before the mind, and at once explains, proves and enforces it. It is written throughout with animation, and will gain the attention of those for whose special use it was prepared.

Edwards on Baptism.

No. 87.

Edwards on Baptism. Candid reasons for renouncing the principles of Anti-Pædobaptism. Also, a Short Method with the Baptists. By Peter Edwards, several years Pastor of a Baptist Church at Portsea, Hant. 18mo. (Min. Lib.)

The author of this volume was once a Baptist clergyman, strongly attached to his peculiar sentiments, and as strongly prejudiced against the doctrine of infant baptism. Possessing, however, a vigorous mind and an honest intention, he examined the subject thoroughly, and the result was a conviction that his former position was untenable. Confining his attention in this essay to a few principal topics, he has produced an argument of unusual power and conclusiveness.

A valuable and instructive collection of pious thoughts and reflections by an eminently good man; to which are appended the resolutions adopted by Jonathan Edwards for the direction of his religious life.

Calvin's Institutes.

Institutes of the Christian Religion. By John Calvin. Translated from the original Latin, and collated with the author's last edition in French. By John Allen. 2 vols. 8vo. (*Min. Lib.*)

This great production of Reformed Theology stands upon such an eminence in the literature of Christianity, and has for three centuries maintained such authority, that we cannot dare to uphold it by any commendations of ours. It would be a singular omission for any minister of our Church to make up a library, however small, which should not contain it, particularly when offered in so attractive a form.

An interesting collection of missionary incidents.

Christian Mother.

No. 92.

Meditations of a Christian Mother, or a practical application of Scripture to the circumstances of herself and her children. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

This charming little volume may be safely recommended to the frequent perusal of Christian mothers. They will find in it many thoughts which will prove comforting to them amidst the various anxieties to which the parental relation subjects them.

Snodgrass on Sanctification.

The Scripture Doctrine of Sanctification stated and defended against the errors of Perfectionism. By the Rev. W. D. SNODGRASS, D. D. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

A discriminating treatise on the doctrine of Sanctification, particularly in relation to its perversion and abuse by modern Perfectionists.

Owen on Indwelling Sin.

Owen is a heavy writer in many respects, and his style is uncouth, but all this is compensated by his critical knowledge of the Scriptures and his deep acquaintance with the workings of the human heart. This is not the least valued of his many practical works.

Lorimer's Church of France.

This is a volume embracing much, and, to most readers, hitherto inaccessible, information respecting the early French Protestant Church in the season of its glory, in its dreadful persecutions, its unhappy decline, and in its present state of comparative revival. The author at the same time has collaterally embodied a history of the Scotch Church, which in its earlier history had many points of similarity with the French Church, although in the result so much more highly favored. The volume is rich in materials, and will be highly valued by the lovers of ecclesiastical history.

The design of this volume is to give a clear and succinct description of Popery. All the peculiarities of that monstrous system are presented, and technical matters explained.

Daillé on the Fathers.

A treatise on the right use of the Fathers in the decision of Controversies existing at this day in Religion. By John Daillé, Minister of the Gospel in the Reformed Church of Paris. With a Preface by the Rev. G. Jekyll, Ll. B. Second American edition. 12mo. (Min. Lib.)

A valuable and learned work, which should be found in the library of ministers of all Protestant denominations. The method is admirably clear, the very table of contents presenting a compact argument. The Fathers are stripped of that false glory which they never assumed themselves, but which has been thrust upon them by their fond admirers, and the Scriptures are shown to be the only rule of faith and practice.

McCrie's Reformation in Italy. No. 118

History of the Progress and Suppression of the Reformation in Italy in the Sixteenth Century. Including a Sketch of the History of the Reformation in the Grisons. By the Rev. THOMAS MCCRIE, D. D. 12mo. (Min. Lib.)

Even Italy, so long the seat of Antichrist, once partook of the light of the Reformation, but having put away that light from her, she is sunk into gross darkness. The author of this history displays in it the same research and accuracy, and the same bold and spirited style, which characterize his other writings. It has special interest at the present day.

The minor poems which compose this volume are from various sources, and many of them possess great merit. It is superior in its mechanical execution, and is illustrated with several exquisite wood engravings

Calvin Defended.

This volume is a suitable companion for the former, but is more didactic in its character.

There are few books which we should place, with higher hopes of usefulness, in the hands of an intelligent physician or cultivator of science than this simple but authentic and beautiful Memoir of two men whose names are as familiar in the departments of medicine and natural science as they will be precious in the memory of the Church of God.

The work extends over a portion of Church history with which few readers are familiar, and which is yet extremely interesting. None can read it without profit, or without arriving at a conviction that St. Patrick was no papist, but a faithful and pious missionary of the Cross of Christ.

From Dawn to Dark in Italy.

From Dawn to Dark in Italy: A Tale of the Reformation in the Sixteenth Century. 16mo.

It is a "historical tale of the Reformation, prepared with great care from the best authorities on the subject. It presents a faithful picture of a period—the most eventful in the religious history of Italy—when the light that had always lingered among the Vaudois in the recesses of the Alps seemed rising and spreading on the horizon." But this rising light after a brief interval, amid blood and fire, gave place to a deep darkness which has continued to our own day. The life of Elisha and the deeply interesting times in which he lived are set before us in a most lively and impressive manner. The Holy Scriptures are elucidated and expounded in fact, though not in form. Much value is added to the volume by Dr. Howard's prefixed Memoir,

in which the life, labors and character of Dr. Lowrie are judiciously and touchingly depicted. The book also has an admirable portrait of the author for its frontispiece.

Jenny Geddes.

The author takes the well-known incident of Jenny Geddes hurling her stool at the prelate in the High Church at Edinburgh to go into a historical discussion of the vital principles of Presbyterianism. The book, though popular in its cast, shows much reading and reflection, and is a valuable addition to our denominational literature.

Admiral Coligny and the Huguenots. No. 915.

Admiral Coligny and the Rise of the Huguenots. By the Rev. Wm. M. BLACKBURN, D. D., Professor of Biblical and Ecclesiastical History in the Theological Seminary of the North-west, and author of "William Farel," "Ulrich Zwingli," etc. 2 vols. 12mo. (Cong. Lib.)

A very full and perspicuous account of the rise of the Huguenots and of their history until after the horrible massacre of St. Bartholomew. The author has made use of a large number of works, many of them exceedingly rare. The work has all the distinctness and vivacity of a dramatic picture. The noble and pious Admiral Coligny occupies the central position as a sort of personification of Huguenotism, the chief historical character of that age in France. All who read it will regard it as a most thrilling and instructive picture of the times of the Reformation.

Commentary on Conf. of Faith. No. 916.

A Commentary on the Confession of Faith. With questions for theological students and Bible classes. By the Rev. Archibald Alexander Hodge, D. D., author of "The Atonement," and Professor of Didactic and

Polemical Theology in the Western Theological Seminary at Allegheny, Pa. 12mo. (Cong. Lib.)

An analysis of the Confession of Faith, with proofs and illustrations of its teachings. It aims to bring out into full relief the natural, obvious and generally-admitted sense of the text. Its design is simply to stimulate and facilitate the study of this eminent embodiment of Christian truth among Bible-class scholars, theological students, ruling elders and ministers. The first chapter contains a short history of creeds and confessions; the second, some account of the origin of the Westminster Confession and Catechisms; the remainder is what the title imports—a commentary on the successive chapters and sections of the Confession.

Pomponia.

Pomponia; or, The Gospel in Cæsar's Household. By Mrs. Webb, 'author of "Alypius of Tagaste." 16mo. (S. S. Lib.)

This exceedingly interesting narrative describes the way in which the leaven of Christianity worked and spread among the people in the days of its early purity and power. The scene is laid partly in Britain and partly in the city of Rome while the Apostle Paul was still living. Many of the personages mentioned are historical; some of them are mentioned in Scripture. The author depicts in vivid colors the difficulties and the triumphs of early Christianity in the courts of Tiberius Cæsar and of Nero. The volume will be found both delightful and instructive to all its readers, young and old.

Alypius of Tagaste.

This volume opens at Alexandria in Egypt, and gives a vivid picture of a terrible scene in the amphitheatre, where several Christians were devoured by wild beasts because of their Christian faith. It presents to the reader, in a well-connected and most attractive narrative, views of the persecutions and struggles of the Christians in an early age of the Church, and exhibits the power of Christian faith to triumph over all opposition.

To illustrate the truth that feebleness of health and lack of means are not insuperable barriers to usefulness, and to show how much may be done by the proper improvement of time, is the object of this book, which tells of the life of an invalid girl in Western New York.

The positive thought and straightforward yet reverent style of the author will commend the book to the attention of many who are not wont to be attracted by discussions on so old, even though so vital, a theme.

The latest developments of the spread of Christianity there form a splendid contrast to the dark days in which its power was shown in the faithfulness unto fetters and death of its early martyrs. Eleven engravings add to the attractiveness of the book, which is one of more than ordinary value.

Parsonage in the Hartz.

A truly German tale, all alive with German thought, feeling and action, and unfolding phases of daily life and spiritual conflict striking to the American reader. It brings out the thought that the Christian heart lives in a supreme devotion to Christ as the Lord and centre of the believer's soul. Love and marriage enter into the current of the story, but they are tributary to this idea, and to that of implicit submission to the orderings of an all-wise God.

Which is the Apostolic Church? No. 1151.

Which is the Apostolic Church? By the Rev. THOMAS WITHEROW, D. D., Professor of Church History, Londonderry, Ireland. Edited and annotated by the Rev. R. M. PATTERSON. 18mo. (Cong. Lib.)

This admirably compact and convincing book goes directly to the Scriptures with the inquiry as to the form of church government there taught. Then it asks what modern church most largely embodies those principles in its government, and thus is nearest to the apostolic Church. Valuable notes have been added by the Rev. Robert M. Patterson of Philadelphia.

Inlets and Outlets.

Inlets and Outlets. Familiar Talks about the Five Senses. By the Rev. CHARLES A. SMITH, D. D., author of "Among the Lilies," etc., etc. 16mo. Four Illustrations. (S. S. Lib.)

The "inlets and outlets" by which the soul holds intercourse with the outer world are the five senses. In this attractive volume the organs of sense, their structure and uses, are so brought to the apprehension of young readers as to interest whilst instructing them. Fiction has its place, but fact is better.

The Presbyterian Church will recognize in this Digest both the intelligence and the scrupulous fidelity to truth of its compiler. Its arrangement is luminous, while the Syllabus of Contents with which it opens, and the Alphabetical Index with which it closes, add immensely to its value as a book of reference. It should be owned not only by the Synods and Presbyteries, but by each Session of the Presbyterian Church.

Little Lights.

Little Lights, and How they Shone. 18mo. With Illustrations. (S. S. Lib.)

A pleasant book for the home and the Sabbath-school, telling the story of an industrial school in the city of New York. Its pupils, guided by their teacher, out of their deep poverty secured money that they might give for the enlightenment of others.

Paradise.

Paradise. The Place and State of Saved Souls between Death and the Resurrection. By the Rev. R. M. PATTERSON. 16mo. (Cong. Lib.)

This volume has already met a gratifying welcome from the public. Sound and scriptural in its views, clear in its style and cheering in its tone, it strengthens the reader while instructing him as to the state of the blessed in the mansions prepared for them by Christ. It has a special value to those from whom loved ones have been taken to the better land. It discusses the word "Paradise" and the place; its inhabitants and locality; the state of souls in Paradise, and their employments; their holiness, happiness and home-life.

The plates having been put into the hands of the Board of Publication, the book is sent forth anew on its mission of love.

"Had I seen this noble work of Edwards before I published on the same subject," says John Angell James, "I should hardly have allowed my work (Christian Charity Explained) to go to press. It is admirable, every word of it."

It is a Bible Dictionary, including (with a very few exceptions) only words in our authorized English version of the Scriptures; and it also treats, with entire freedom of statement, the words which underlie the faith and order of the Christian churches, such as Baptism, Bishop, Elder, Election, Predestination. Presbyterianism finds abundant support of its faith and order in a faithful exposition of Bible terms. The work was entrusted by the Board of Publication to the Rev. Thomas J. Shepherd, D. D., who has devoted to it much study and patient,

as well as skillful, labor. Numerous engravings and maps especially engraved for the book furnish valuable illustration to the text of the work, which, we venture to say, condenses more of the results of ancient and modern scholarship than can elsewhere be found in the same space.
