## FINLEY MILLIGAN FOSTER, D. D., Ph. D.

F. M. Foster, whose biographical sketch appears in Thompson's Sketches of the Ministers up to the year 1930, when that volume was published, was in that year pastor of the Third Reformed Presbyterian Congregation of New York City. He continued to serve this congregation until 1940, when he was released from the active pastorate and made Pastor Emeritus. His pastorate had covered a span of fifty-three years. For sixty years he served as a member of the church's Board of Foreign Missions, for many of them its recording secretary, and then president. On the night of January 10, 1948, his spirit returned to God who gave it. At the time of his death he was ninety-five years of age. At the meetings of Synod, Presbytery, and all the boards of which he was a member, he was faithful in attendance, active in the deliberations, wise, firm, and kindly in his counsels, and earnest and forceful in his appeals for the truth.
