A paragraph having appeared in one of the public papers giving an exaggerated representation of the disorders which have recently taken place in the college here, it is thought proper to state; that though the riot was violent no personal injury whatever was sustained by any individual, that the orders of the college were suspended for about six and thirty hours, and have ever since been proceeding peaceably in their usual courses And that notwithstanding the inflexible determination

of the authority of the college to entorce its laws, the probability is, that
eventually not more than a fourth parti
of the students will be found to anve
had such a concern in the late unhappy
and riotous proceedings, as to require
their permanent exclusion from the institution.
