April 6. 1787 on Friday  
got up very early, and set  
off for New London, got there  
about 8. o'clock, and found a  
Passage going directly to Sag  
Harbor; a boat so he set sail  
the vessel I mention is called  
Stirling Packet, William  
Booth Master; and he had  
contrary wind and small and  
contrary tide also, and he was  
obliged to return to New London  
got there again before ten  
o'clock, and I went over to Boston  
and lay at Mr. Lister's, and  
was very <sup>kindly</sup> received. had com-  
fortable rest. —

Saturday April 7: got up  
very early, and went down  
to the ferry, called on Esq. &  
Lempford, and was received  
friendly, and he desired me

I take Breakfast with them,  
but I have in hand, and Mr J  
gave me a good bunch of peat  
and Bread, enough to last me  
a whole Day, and went directly  
west, and went a Board about  
8, and let sail again, and had  
small and contrary wind, and  
we were obliged to run into Sea  
Brook and there he spent the  
Night, I lay on a board.

Sabb. April 8<sup>th</sup> I at sea very  
early and we had <sup>got</sup> under  
sail, and we had very small  
wind and not fair land we  
went on slowly, and got north  
part of Mulling, and there  
I went ashore about 3:00: &  
and I Travell'd to South part of  
Call's at a Certain House, and  
the woman of the House knew  
me, the Name of the woman of  
the House is M<sup>rs</sup> M<sup>rs</sup> Abbott

it hear man towards Night  
the man hear not at home and  
the woman desired to stay all  
Night, and I accepted by her  
offer. Just at Night the man  
came home from meeting and  
appeared very agreeable, and  
was well treated, both by  
you with them, and heard to  
bed pretty soon, and had com-  
fortable rest.

Monday April 9 got up early  
and it was very foggy morn-  
ing, and I thought to take my  
pass, and after that I went  
to the Ferry, and was detained  
along while, and about 9  
was carried over, on Shelter  
Island, and there I tried at  
several House to hire a Horse  
but I could get none, and so  
went on a foot, till got to Bay

Harbor, which was about 4  
miles, and I was very much  
beaten out when I got there. I  
never meant to get on foot since  
I have been lame, and I tried  
there to get a Horse, and I could  
not, and then <sup>was</sup> a good Capt  
Parker met with me, and he  
tried to get me a Horse and he  
could not, and so he and I rode  
together on his Horse, and when  
I was some time before night  
and then I rode, and he was  
extremely kindly treated, and  
he got me a Horse that night to  
go to Southampton on the  
morrow,

Tuesday April 10: Got up  
early and took Breakfast  
with them, and about 9 I went  
on, and to the Place about  
11: called on Mr Williams, and  
was there a little while and  
was satisfied, that the Presby

They did not meet till next Day  
and I went on to Calo Spring  
where the Indians live, and  
happened to call at one house  
Peter's, he lives not at home  
but the woman does, and she  
appeared very agreeable, &  
soon found out the man or  
professor, and some time  
towards night the man came  
home, I took dinner home,  
after a while I went land  
business came to me, and we  
soon concluded to have a meet-  
ing in the Evening, and so  
in the evening the Indians  
came together at the House  
and there was a considerable No.  
and I spoke to them from 1. King  
XIX. 13: and there was very good  
attention, I lodged at the same  
House, and rested well. —

Wednesday April 11: rose early  
and after Prayers, Brother Peter  
and I went to Brother S. Hannus,  
and there took breakfast, and  
soon after breakfast, I went to  
see old Widow Hannus, and ~~was~~  
but few minutes, and I went to  
the Town, got there past 9 and  
the Presbytery had got together  
a hour so we went to meeting  
and the Rev<sup>d</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Knell opened  
the Presbytery by Prayer and  
then a sermon Sublime to the  
occasion, from 2 Corin 7. 23. and  
soon after meeting, we returned  
to M<sup>r</sup> Williams, and Dined toge-  
ther, and after Dinner, we pro-  
ceeded in business, and several  
things were in negotiation and  
hecht on in business, Harmoni-  
ously, in the Evening, I went to  
there even, and I went to the  
Prayers, at the House of one



Simon Tilton, and the students  
were ~~was~~ being attentive and  
the Christians became somewhat  
entire. I spoke from John  
v. 10. after meeting we sat up  
some what late, and sat up  
today at the same house.

Thursday April 12: got up  
early and took breakfast  
and then after went to town  
got there after the Ministers  
had got together and he  
heard on <sup>in</sup> our business, and  
there was preaching again  
and the people wanted I  
should preach, but I chose  
to attend upon the Presh  
Levy, and M<sup>r</sup> Bradford P.  
Friday April 13: we met  
early, and heard on P<sup>r</sup>ef.

night, and about 2, I was  
obliged to go to Bridgeman  
place, to preach, got there  
there about half after 3  
and went right into the  
meeting House, for the  
had been waiting a while  
I spoke from Mark 4:  
and there was great atten-  
tion. Soon after meeting I  
went to with Mr. Weymouth to  
Colo. Halcen's and Mr. Buell  
went with us, and there we  
took Tea and soon after  
Tea I went to Mr. Persons  
and had another meeting there  
and there was a great number  
of people, and I ~~spoke~~ spoke to  
them from 12: 28. 29 and there  
was a solemn attention among  
the people. I lodged at Mr. Buell's

Angels and heard to God soon  
and had comfortable rest —

Tuesday April 11: got up  
early and took breakfast  
with the family and soon after  
eating Mr. Person and I went  
down to Long Harbor, got there  
about 12: and was till about  
12: took dinner with one Mr.  
and soon after dinner I went  
on board of one Mr. Case from  
South Hole, and he had a  
tray dine and it was here  
and he got to Point of Sable  
on a Neck of Land called May  
Neck just about low tide and  
I heard a noise and heard one  
Capt. Kurlow, and the Lodge  
and was very kindly entertained  
the man of the Harpel was very  
sick, very like to die; went  
to God soon, and had comforta-  
ble sleep —

Sabb April 15: got up very  
early, and then got me Horse  
and went on to the town, spent  
at one M<sup>r</sup> and he got  
his chair ready soon and he car-  
ried to the town, got to M<sup>r</sup> Store  
about 9: found them well, and  
I took breakfast with them, and  
about 10 he went to meeting, &  
there was a great Number of 22  
People, and I spoke from 1 Cor XVI  
and there was a solemn attention.  
In the after Noon I went to the off  
low Meeting House, a Card 5 miles  
M<sup>r</sup> Horton carried me in his Chair  
and there was a large Congregation  
Town, and I spoke from Dan. 4. 25,  
and the People a tender & religious  
attention and solemnity. After  
the meeting was over, he  
went back to the old Town, stop  
a while at M<sup>r</sup> Gueson's and took  
Tea there, and went on got to  
the Town some Time before Sun-  
Set. Spent at M<sup>r</sup> Store, and

Candle Lighting we went to  
meeting, and there was a  
large assembly again, and  
I spoke from Gen. 11:5  
and the People attended well  
after meeting went to Mr. Horton  
and then to Ledger, and here  
was, kindly treated.

Monday April 16: got up  
before Day Break, and called  
on Mr. Bradford who was then  
preaching in the town, he  
wishes to go with me to Sister Point  
and he got ready soon, and  
here on horse back before ten  
o'clock, and went on to Sister Point  
at one Seneca Trutt's, and  
there took Breakfast, and as  
soon as he had some, he went  
on, and got to the Point, about  
10 and called at Mr. Trutt's &  
I resided there for a hour that  
was to take me in at this place  
took dinner home, and just  
as he had done the Boat came

and I went to the shore and  
M<sup>r</sup> Kneff and M<sup>r</sup> Tuttle  
went with, and I took leave  
of them at the shore and  
went at board, and we had  
a fair wind, and just before  
Sun set we arrived at the City  
of New London; and I lay  
at M<sup>r</sup> Muxfle, and had com-  
fortable sleep —

Today April 17 got up  
very early, and heeds about  
the City till afternoon and  
then I had an opportunity  
to go with M<sup>r</sup> Nathan Champ  
of Lyme up to M<sup>r</sup> Houghton's  
Cove, we got there some time  
before Sun set, and I got there  
and went home got there  
about Sun down, and found  
my family in good health  
but my wife, she complains  
some Pains yet, but not so  
bad as I left her, she is better

Thanks be to god for his good  
mercies to us.

Tuesday April 22 went to Mr  
Elijah Browns at Mays  
peak Point, and preached  
there. I spoke from Isai: 1:2  
in the after-noon from  
Lech VIII. 21: and there was  
a large Assembly for a big  
Place, and the People attend  
ed well. Soon after meeting  
took Tea, and after eating  
went Home

Tuesday April 24. We had  
a Mournful Day, we attend  
upon two Funerals at one  
House. Widow Poquams Corpse  
was brought to Widow Lunnies  
Occasion. Where there was  
another Corpse, Lunnies Daugh-  
ter Lunnies was Dead, these  
Died the Day before. Within

an hour or half of each  
other, and there was most  
all our Indians together, and  
I delivered a Discourse to them,  
from John 18. 4 and the words  
fell with Power among the  
People, and soon as I had  
done we march'd to the Burying  
Place, and lay bury'd the dead  
first, and as soon as we had  
done we return'd severally  
to our Houses —

Saturday April 28. just be-  
fore Noon I set off from Home  
and went to Stonington. Stopt  
a while at M<sup>r</sup> Christies in  
the Landing, and took Dinner  
there, and soon after eating  
went on, and got to John  
Quinmans just before Sun  
Set, and there I Lodg'd and  
was much out of order had  
very bad Colds, rest of some

Sabb April 29: it was fair  
ny and rained some, near  
about 10 went to meeting  
and People collected and  
there was a large number  
of People, and I spoke from  
Acts 13: 17. and 2 Corin V. 20  
and there was very great  
attention many there were  
shed, the Christians comforted  
Soon after meeting left the  
Indian Town, and went to  
a rotten Indian Town, they  
at Telex Desjones and there  
took Dinner, just at night  
went to widow Sampson, and  
there we had meeting again  
I spoke from Rom III: 18.  
and the People were greatly  
convinced there were, the  
young People here much  
affected, and after meeting

we. Got up a great while  
and had a greivable conser-  
vation, and it was past mid  
Night when we went to bed  
and I rested well — — —

Monday April 30 got up early  
and we pray'd together, and  
took Breakfast together, and  
I spoke to them a bout Gospel  
Rules and the Discipline of the  
House of God; and about 9  
I took leave of them: Call'd out  
M<sup>r</sup> John Williams, and propos'd  
to go on to the north  
at 10 o' clock. Stopt at  
at Norwich Landing, and  
got Home about 2 in the after  
Noon, and found my Family  
as well as I left them — — —

Tuesday May 1. Went to get  
at M<sup>r</sup> Eliza's house, and  
there took Dinner, and soon  
after Dinner, went over the  
River; some of M<sup>r</sup> Daniel

and Elijah Brown's Family  
went over with me, in a large  
Congregation - and went to Capt  
Wyllis, and there was a con-  
siderable of People collected  
together, and I spoke to  
them from Rom: VIII. 38. 39  
and there was a solemn at-  
tention, many of them much  
affected; soon after meeting  
I went over with the same  
People that came with me  
stayed a few minutes at Mr  
E. Brown's, and past on  
homeward, got home near  
I am Sir -

Saturday May 5. Some  
time in the afternoon, went  
down to Gail's Ferry, and  
went over home, and got

and got to Mr. Givins  
Sanders, a short time sit,  
and found them all well  
and was kindly received by  
the Family and Lodged  
there,

Sabb. May 6, near to be  
went to Mr. William Anson,  
Fowery. he hears of the Prin-  
ciple men in the Place,  
and then hears a Court Cou-  
rse of People, and Mr.  
Keene Preachd, from  
John 11: 25. soon after ten  
men he carried the Corpse  
to the Burialling ground, about  
4 miles off, and I went to  
Mr. Sanders, and soon  
went to Capt. Downe Lutherin  
and there took Dinner and  
toward Night, People Collec

ted together and I presented  
to them from VIII. 2. and there  
has been great attention, and  
just as it concluded it began  
to rain, I Lodged at the same  
House, and was very kind  
ly entertained, went to bed  
soon, and was well refreshed  
with sleep.

Monday May 4. Went to  
M<sup>r</sup>. Sunders to break my  
fast with them, soon after  
took leave of them, and  
then went back to M<sup>r</sup>.  
Lathens, and took leave  
of them, and so took of  
several Families, and  
then went down to the Ferry  
and went over to New London  
and so on to M<sup>r</sup>. Sam. Rogers's  
and there had a meeting

and there was a large Col  
lection of People, and I spoke  
from Job XXI: 14. 15 and there  
was great solemnity, soon  
after meeting took tea with  
them, and went on my  
heavy harness, got home  
some time in the evening  
and went to bed. —

Saturday, May 12. about 2  
in the afternoon left home  
and went to one Capt Water  
house, and it was Rainy  
stopt a while at Doc Rogers,  
took dinner there, and I blessed  
the Doc, and just at Night  
heard to Mr. John Brown, and  
I Lodge, and was kindly  
entertained —

Sabb: May 13: got up early,  
and had my horse up  
and went on, and it was  
Rainy still, I got lost.

Plenary. Darts about 8  
and took breakfast there,  
near to he went to meeting  
at Capt Waterhouses and  
there was not many people  
and I spoke from Luke x. 26  
and there had good attention  
in the afternoon, I spoke  
from John XII. 36 and there  
was great many people  
and they attended with  
great solemnity and affec-  
tion. Soon after meeting  
took dinner, and after eat-  
ing went away intending  
to go to Mr John Brunner's to  
preach; but it rained still  
and it was cold, and I stopt  
at Mr Darts, and I did not  
feel well, and there I lay  
and went to bed. —

early and went down to

Rainy Still and Chilly, soon  
got to the City, and called on  
Mr. Moxley, and there took  
breakfast; and was in the

the morning left home, and went  
to Mr. M<sup>r</sup> Post's in Waco's Hill.  
Got there some before meeting  
and there was but a small  
collection of People he began  
the Service a little past 10 and  
I spoke from Habk III. 17 18:  
and the afternoon from  
Psalm 119. 105; and the People  
attended well, after meeting  
to Victuals, and soon after  
eating went home. Stopt at  
Mr. Moxley's and had his Dinner

Saturday May 26. About 3  
in the afternoon, I took leave  
of my family, and set off  
for Weymouth, went by the way  
of Windsor, got there about  
after ten o'clock, put up at Mr  
Lethrop's or Leppel's Preacher  
and was very kindly received  
Lodged there,

Sabb May 27, got me up  
very early and went to Windsor  
got to the Place before  
9 and near 11 went to meeting  
and Mr Gowley Preacher, he  
spoke from John, Braam is  
in the afternoon I spoke from  
1 Peter II: 17. The People at  
tended well, - and towards  
Night went on to Mr Wells  
and there I lodged and was  
kindly treated,

Monday May 28. got me  
up early, and took Breakfast  
and went on my way to  
a little while at Mr. Strong's  
and to post on, and got  
to my Daughter, about 2  
in the afternoon and then  
I stay, found them all well  
as common.

Tuesday May 29. got up  
very early, and went on, stop  
at Mr. M'Cluer's in Old Windsor,  
took Breakfast with them, and  
soon after went over the Ri-  
ver, and on to Wenthorough,  
called on Mr. Woolcut the  
Minister of the Place, but  
he was not at Home, took  
Dinner there, and soon af-  
ter post on, called on Mr.

took breakfast with the fami-  
ly, and soon after went on  
to Torrington, got M<sup>r</sup>. Haine's  
about to be a Preacher a-  
mong the People, he is mis-  
ter, half white and half Negro  
an extraordinary man in un-  
derstanding, a great Preacher  
I was there some time, took  
Dinner there, and some in  
the after-noon, I went on  
my way again; Stopt at Capt  
Baldwins in Goshen, and they  
wgd to Tarry all Night, and  
I consented, and was kindly  
entertained. Toon Supper  
soon, and went to Bed early  
and rested comfortably —

Friday June 1. got up  
early early, and set off on  
my way; Call'd on Mr Farring  
at Cabnan. but he was not  
at home, took breakfast  
there; and soon after went  
on again. Stopt Capt Bushno  
in Salbray, and there I saw  
Peter Shadich, and Elijah  
Wympe Jun<sup>r</sup> of Brotherton,  
he just come from thence, and  
they were then all well, when  
he came away; Took dinner  
near here, and soon after I  
went on my way; and call'd  
on Mr Dakins but little time  
~~was there~~ <sup>was</sup> there a  
little while and past on, and  
got on the Mountain some  
time before Sun set, and  
call'd at Deacon Brubleys.

but they urg'd me to stay

meeting I went with Mr  
Wimshel to his House &

took Dinner with them  
and as soon as we had  
Dined, M<sup>r</sup> Winkel got  
his Waggon ready and  
he took me into his wag<sup>n</sup>  
and he and his wife went  
to Town to meeting, in  
Elder Dakins, meeting  
and I Preache from  
Peter IV. 7: and there was  
a solemn attention, many  
Tears were shed, soon af  
ter meeting M<sup>r</sup> Rowe took  
me in his waggon and  
Carried me to Mr House, and  
there I Lodg'd, and was  
very tenderly treated, -  
Monday June 4: Lay in  
Bed somewhat late, &  
When all the People got  
up, they got together &

I exercised with my Notes in  
the Family, and it was a large  
Family, it contained near 30, &  
it was a very solemn Season,  
many were much affected  
it took us some Time, to go  
thro', and then we Pray'd, -  
About 2 in the after noon  
we began a meeting, and  
there was a great Number  
of People, and I spoke from  
and there was good  
attention, Soon after meeting  
they got me a Horse, and I went  
on the Mountain, and stopt at  
Mr Winchels, and from there  
I went to Deacon P. Phelps's  
and there took Tea, and soon

to go to keep Sabbath with the  
People in his Place about 12  
miles. Lodged here.

Thursday June 7 Stay here  
all Day, about 3 People got  
together, and we began the meet-  
ing, and a large Number of People  
and I spoke from Docters x. 12-13  
and the People attended well,  
Towed here again.

Friday June 8. After Breakfast  
M<sup>r</sup> Thirstin and I took leave  
of the Family, and went to  
North part of Phillips Town,  
got to the Place about 12: did  
with one M<sup>r</sup> M<sup>c</sup>gee, and  
after eating went on to M<sup>r</sup>  
Thirstin's House, found his  
Family well, Lodged there  
and it is a Christian Family.

We had a meeting here  
in the evening, and there  
was a considerable of P

they never saw me before,  
but the good old man, they  
talked very freely upon  
Religious matters; and I  
conversed with them a while  
and went on again, stoppt  
at M<sup>r</sup> and took  
Breakfast there, they were  
extremely glad to see me,  
soon after leaving went on  
to M<sup>r</sup> Vanderwarbon's, and  
there I put up for the Day, a  
meeting to begin in the  
afternoon took Dinner here  
in the after Noon the People  
collected, and there was not  
many, the Notice was too  
short; I spoke from 2 Kings 20  
and there was very good at-  
tention; and several came  
too late, and after I sat a while  
in the House, I had Conversation  
with my Christian Cows with  
some young Women, that came

Out for the Sermon, and some  
more. Some hearkn'd Startles, but  
Some began, they heard all delight-  
ted, and behav'd very devout,  
and some old People Chose Texts  
also, and it was agreeable ever  
after. I lodged at the same House  
and was extremely well treated  
by the whole Family. — —

Saturday June 16 got early  
and resolv'd to be brought up, and  
I went up before Breakfast, stopt  
at M<sup>r</sup> and they urg'd  
me to eat, but I would not, and  
took leave of them and went on  
stopt at M<sup>r</sup> Jones's and there  
took Breakfast. Soon after eat-  
ing, I went on to visit some friends  
and at Night staid at good  
old M<sup>r</sup> Favors. — —

Sabb June 17: now I went to  
the Church, and there was a  
prodigious gathering of People  
the Church could not contain them  
all, began the Service as five



10. and it began to Rain soon  
I spoke from Ierem. V. 2. 3. &  
John VI. 69. and there was a  
good and affectionate attention  
the Congregation was bowed before  
the word of god; soon after leaving  
I went off to meet to Half Moon, and  
English young men accompa-  
nied me, and we stop'd at Mr  
John Landfords, and there I took  
Tea, and soon after went on, and  
before we reach'd the Place, it  
rain'd very hard, and I was  
very wet that Time we got to the  
Place; stop'd a little while at  
Capt Comstock's, and then went  
to the Church, and there was  
but a little Number of People  
and I spoke from Declare 10.  
and there was very good atten-  
tion, and went back to Capt  
Comstock's and Lodg's, and  
rested independly

Monday June 18, after B

took leave of the Family, and  
went on towards New-Town, got  
M<sup>r</sup> Tenckhoffer, a boat 10, and  
took Dinner with them; and a  
boat 2; we began the worship  
of god; we met in a large house,  
found there was a large number  
of People, Spoke from Psalm  
CXXXVI. 1. and there was a heavy  
deep attention, many were much  
affected. Soon after Service went  
towards London. Stopt at M<sup>r</sup>  
Cluter, and just in the evening  
a Number of People came in,  
preached I then preached, and I  
was some what backward, but  
finally, thought it my Duty,  
to preach, though I was some  
what worried, and I spoke from  
Math VI. 33 and there was greater  
Solemnity, than in the Day  
Time, there was flow of tears,  
and after I had concluded,

the People desired to have an  
Exercise with my Cards, and so  
gratified them, and it was a  
Comfortable Exercise; and we  
sat up very late, at least the  
People desired of, and so I went  
to bed, and rested but poorly  
for a little while, I was much  
and I had but a little sleep - -

Tuesday June 19, got up early  
and got my Horse ready, and  
I went on to Nequam, I got  
at the Ferry, and there I under-  
stood, there were 2 or 3 Families  
of Indians, about half a mile  
off, and so I turned went to see  
them, and they were entire  
Strangers to me, and they were  
miserable poor, and perfect  
Heathens, I asked them, whether  
they ever went to meeting, they  
said no, and told them, I was

was going to Preach, a little way  
and asked them, whether they  
would go to meeting, they said  
nothing, and so I left them, I went  
with one M<sup>r</sup> Ford to the Ferry,  
went into his House, and he  
asked me, whether I had broke  
my fast, and I told him, I had  
not, and so he order his negro  
to get me the usuals directly,  
and he hasten'd, his wife was  
not at Home, and so I sat down  
and eat heartily, soon after  
he carried me over, and asked  
nothing, and went to M<sup>r</sup> Timon  
Fords, and there stopt, and  
took Dinner with them, and after  
Dinner, I layd me down & had  
to rest, and I slept a little, &  
next one we went to meeting  
and there was a multitude  
of People at Church, for such  
short Notice and I spoke

from Isaac's 2:3 and the  
attended with great attention.  
after dinner, took Tea with  
one M<sup>r</sup> and soon  
went on to Shenandoah, and  
got there just before sun set  
and put up at M<sup>r</sup> John Post's  
and found them all well, next  
to bed pretty soon, and a com-  
fortable rest. - this Day saw  
Hindrich Lumbam from Onawa  
and heard by him, that our  
people there were all well  
a haul a fortnit ago -

Wednesday June 20: was at  
Shenandoah, lodged at M<sup>r</sup> Post's  
again -

Thursday June 21: got up early  
and went to Nescane, got there  
at 10 o'clock and then took  
Bussingast, about 9. We went to

meeting, it is a fast Day with  
the Dutch. People everywhere,  
and there was a vast Concourse  
of People collected together. Most  
all Dutch; and about 10 he  
began the Service, the Church  
could not contain all the People  
I spoke from Isaiah I. 11 and  
Lamentation XVIII. 5, 6. Between meetings  
went to Mr. Safely and I fell much  
out of order and I lay in bed  
had a little rest, after meeting  
I went to Mr. Miller's, one of the  
Elders, and he kindly entertained  
both of us with them, soon after  
lay me down, felt quite poorly,  
got up just before Sun set, and  
went to bed soon, and rested com-  
fortably.

Friday, June 22: Rose pretty  
early, and took breakfast, and  
comfortable, and soon after  
eating, took leave of the

Family, and went of to Schenck  
got there about 10. and staye  
in the Place till near Night  
and then took leave of my friends  
and went of and rid a bout 4 miles  
and put up at a certain Tavern,  
and went to Bed soon, and here some  
what disturb'd by the Company that  
was there they made much Noise.  
a long while

Saturday June 23 got up early  
and rode my Horse to the Colledge  
and I push'd on soon, and  
went to Mr. Hoober's and there  
took breakfast, they were very  
glad to see me, and soon after  
breakfast went on again, and  
stopt at Mr. Bartlett's and was  
kindly receiv'd, and they soon  
put out my Horse, and said I  
shoud. Tarry there that Night  
took dinner with them, and was  
sent after, Mr. Bartlett and I.

went over the River, to see Mr  
Wedder, and they have exceeding  
glad to see me both our young  
after a while I lay down and  
took Sleep, and just a Night  
we took Tea with them, and then  
the Boys carried us over back  
again, and went to see B  
had a comfortable rest. —

Sabbath June 24, a Lord's Day  
went down, the west side of the  
River, and left my Hoop at a  
certain town, and went  
over to \_\_\_\_\_ and there  
we had a meeting, and there  
was a prodigious Number of  
People, we began the Service  
a little after 10, and I spoke  
from Evod XX. in the after  
Noon from 2 Corin V. 20. and then  
an affectionate attention, may



many more bowed under the  
wood. Soon after meeting went  
Beck over the River, and went  
with one M<sup>r</sup> <sup>he is</sup>  
an English man, and was very  
kindly treated. —

Monday June 24, got up quite  
early, and at 10 M<sup>r</sup> Hocobron's  
and presently after 3 o'cl. it began  
to rain, and the People began  
to gather soon, and it rained hard  
till there was a large Number  
of Peopl, and I began the meet-  
ing about 10, and there had a little  
Intermission, and Preach'd again  
in the Noon and the People  
attended with great solemnity  
many Tears were shed. I spoke  
from Acts <sup>and Proverbs</sup>  
Lodge at the same House and went  
back soon and rested well —

Tuesday June 26, got up very  
early and took leave of them

and went of to Mr George Eliot,  
got there about 8. and took  
Breakfast, and after eating  
went to see old Mr Eliot, about  
a mile of, and took Dinner there  
and soon after went back to  
meeting at Mr George Eliot's  
and there was a long number  
of People, I spoke from Song 110  
and the People, attended with  
great solemnity, baptised one child  
<sup>for a baptism</sup> after meeting  
went to the House, for we met  
under Trees, and I stay  
there all Night.

Wednesday June 27 got up  
quite early, and set of to the  
Westward, call'd on several  
and got to see Mr Esq's Mark  
and there I lodged.

Thursday June 28. Stay'd till  
after Breakfast, and then had  
of once more, stay'd at several

Wander, got to Dr<sup>r</sup> Harper's  
about 10 at Fort Hunter, and  
stayed there till about 3, and  
then took leave of them, and  
went on my way. Reached  
to Dr<sup>r</sup> Mayhew's at Conne-  
johogus just after sun-set  
and I lodged there, and was  
kindly treated; The Dr<sup>r</sup> Mayhew  
not at home; went to bed soon  
and had comfortable rest -

Thursday June 28, got up  
early, and had my horse got  
ready, and went on towards  
Bowman's Creek, got to Dr<sup>r</sup>  
Kimball's about 10, and there  
I put up for the Day, and con-  
cluded to preach here on the  
Morrow, went to see some friends  
and lodged at Dr<sup>r</sup> Kimball's

Thursday June 29, was at  
the P. M., went to fishing in  
the Creek Catch'd 62 Small fish  
took Dinner with the L. of again  
and about 2 went to meeting &  
there was but People, and I spoke  
from 2 Kings XX. 1 and it was a  
solemn meeting many hearts were  
affected. as soon as the meeting  
was done I went on towards Spring  
field. Stopt at M<sup>r</sup> Lucas and  
took Tea, and as soon he had  
done I went on again; got to  
see as to M<sup>r</sup> Whitvot's Tavern  
and there I Lodg'd

Saturday June 30, got up very  
early and pack'd my provisions  
and went on my way. Stopt at  
at M<sup>r</sup> Miller's, kind part on; Stopt  
again at M<sup>r</sup> Diker's and there  
I rode my best, was very kindly  
entertained, soon after break  
fast went on gain, got to B<sup>r</sup>  
Crippin's about 10. and was

kindly received. There I stay'd  
in the after noon, went to see  
some Friends, was kindly re-  
ceived by all; towards night  
went back to Brother Crispin's  
and I Lodg'd.

Sabb. July, a Society went to  
meeting at one Mr Waubrats &  
and there was a large number  
of People. I spoke from John  
what is that to thee? &c. in the after-  
noon from Rom VIII. and there  
was a melting attention. I believe  
many felt the Power of the word  
there was a flow of Tears. after  
meeting stay'd at the House till  
near Night, then there was a word  
sent me to go to Mr Richards,  
and a Number of us went, and  
he related a strange sight he  
had seen, twice and dreamt  
a bout it once; There has been  
9 Persons Baptized, fortnit  
ago, by way of impressing or

Plunging; a few Days after  
this man heard of it by the  
Place, and he happened to  
cast his Eyes to the Place  
where the Person were kept  
tied: he says he <sup>saw</sup> a man  
struggling to rise out of the  
Water, and the Water being  
a round him, and it was  
gone in a moment, and it  
put his mind in great agi-  
tation, and Consternation. a  
few Days after he went <sup>in</sup>  
to the Place, and he saw just  
such a sight again, and it put  
him to great amazement  
and a Night or two back, he  
dreamt, he went to the Place  
again, and saw just such  
a sight again, and he was  
greatly surpris'd, and he  
kept it to himself till this Day  
and he says, he could not keep

it any longer, and to let it  
to his family, and relate it to  
me, and to a number of People  
and it took effect upon some  
People, Tho they don't know  
what to make of it, - in the  
evening we went back to  
M<sup>r</sup> Wharol, and there I dined  
and had good rest - - -

Monday July 2 after breakfast  
sent all of mine more (all on  
M<sup>r</sup> Wharol, and took my  
things, and about 10 took leave  
of them, and went on, call'd  
on M<sup>r</sup> Sprague near the Lake  
and was there a while, and  
went on again, and got to  
Andrews Field a little past  
12, and there I stop'd some time  
I woud my Horse out to feed &  
took Dinner myself, - about  
2 I went on again, and went

a New way, and got to the  
upper part of Gardman Flats,  
and as I came out of the woods,  
and had a view of the Flats,  
I did not know it, I was quite  
lost, I went to an House, that  
was build by, and I did know  
the House, and it was as if  
that I well knew too, and I  
asked a woman, where the Mo-  
hawk River was, she pointed  
to the Flats, and said there -  
and I asked her where Mr  
Fols lived, she said about 2  
miles, and then every thing  
came right, and so went  
on, and got to Mr. Fols, in  
the dusk of the Evening, &  
and they were glad to see  
me once more and then  
I put up, and went to



Bed soon and comfortable  
Rest, none more.

Tuesday July 3. Some Time  
after Breakfast, took my old  
Horse and went down the River  
and got about a mile, I met  
John Tully, one of our People  
from Brotherton, and he gave  
me an Intelligence of the State  
and Situation of our People, they  
were well in general. Several of  
them Died since I left them, &  
I went on, and went with me,  
went so far as one M<sup>r</sup>. Smiths  
Merchant, and there but a little  
while, and we went back got to  
M<sup>r</sup>. Folis near 12 and took Dinner  
there, and Lay the rest of the Day  
and Lode there again.

Wednesday July 4: got up early  
and was getting ready to go thro  
the Wilderness, and just as we

Set down to Breakfast, Brother  
David Fowler, his wife their  
Daughter-Mercy and Sister  
Brother Jacob Fowler's Widow came  
in, and were glad to see one a-  
nother once more: and after  
Breakfast we had some Conver-  
sation together, and then they  
went off, and John Tuckey and  
I went on our way also, and  
we had a fine Day to go thro'  
the woods, and we stopt a while  
at Chikungwee, and here  
lives a negro, he is all alone  
and has planted some Corn &  
it is a fine spot of ground, where  
he has pitched his Tent, we sat  
here some time, bated my Horse  
and after a while we set off  
again; and we got thro' the  
a little while before Sun set  
Call'd at John Tuckey's and  
they were all well, and

Took Dinner with John, here I  
found Widow Peter from Long  
Island, an old acquaintance  
of mine, here was a num-  
ber of young men working  
for John, and seemed to be glad  
to see me. and then I went to  
my Daughter Christiana, and  
and gave them all a kiss, and we  
rejoiced to see each other once  
more. - Blessed and adored be God  
for his infinite goodness and mercy  
to my Children, my Daughter  
and her Husband, I have a comfort-  
able Hope, that they have life  
in God thro' Jesus Christ -  
Loved at my Daughter -
