number of People, and they
attended well, we lodged
at the same House —

Tuesday Dec^r 18: got up early
and took Breakfast, and soon
after took leave of the Family
and went on our way and
trav'd about 30 miles and put
up at a Tavern —

Wednesday Dec 19 got up
early and went out on our way
and got Staffordborough some
time in the afternoon and
we called in at one M^r Straight
and there he had a meeting
in the evening, and there was
a large number of people for
a short notice, and the people
attended with great fervor
& John from
we stayed at the same house
and were kindly entertained
by the family

Thursday Dec 20: got up
early and took breakfast
with the family, and then
after eating we went on
again and got to Esq^{rs} ^{at}
some time before noon and
there we stayed, and in the
evening we had a meeting in
a school house and one
of us there was present

number of People and there
was great solemnity among
the People, after meeting
went back to Log^s Finnesen
and the Lodge.

Friday Dec^r 21: Sometime
after Breakfast we went
into Nine Partners, and
stopt at M^r Gaffley's, and
in the Evng we had a M^r
and there was a prodigious
number of People, and there
was great seriousness.

Lodged at the same House
this Family is a Christian
Family in deed. —

Saturday Dec^r 22 we were
here about all Day —

Sabbth Dec^r 23 after Break
fast we went to meeting to
a Place call'd the Hollow,
went with M^r Gaffley in the

Sunday, and it was a dread-
ful Storm of Snow, yet there
was good many People, and
they attended well. Soon after
Meeting, he went back, and
he stop'd at Collo
and took Dinner there, and
soon after eating, he went
on again, and got to Mr
Galleys before Night, and
in the Evening the People
came together, and I spoke
to them, and there was
great solemnity in the
meeting, and after meeting
he had Conversation with his
Cousins and it was late be-
fore the People Dipp'd
and he lodg'd at the same
House —

Monday Dec 24. got up
very early, and went to

in Pleasant Valley with M^r
Gaffney and his Daughter
John the 1st Day, got there be-
fore meeting, and about
11: we went to meeting and
there was a large Number
of People, and with great
Solemnity the People attend
the word of god. Directly af-
ter meeting we went to M^r
Platts, and there he had
another meeting, and there
was a great many People
M^r Culp & M^r Groves were
there and I spoke from
James IV. 14 and as soon as
I had done speaking M^r
Groves began, and spoke
some time with great fir-
mness, and when he had
done, M^r Culp got up and

he spoke some Time, with
great earnestness, and the
People the more greatly so
learned, and it was a power-
ful meeting; the Lord has
been visiting the People
about here with his Divine
Power, many have been
converted to God, and after
meeting he took leave one
of another and it was an
affectionate parting. We
led out the same Horse
and had quiet sleep —

Tuesday Dec 25: Some Time
in the Morning, we went
on our way after we had
taken leave of the Family, &
directed our Course to Rough
Creeper, and to down the
River, about 4. miles and
thence to went over the River

and we went into a House
where one M^r Havens lives
and his Wife was upon point
of Death, I asked her some Que-
stions her Comfortable in her
mind and was willing to leave
the World, I pray with her &
and then went on, got to
Major De Boies before night
and there he put up, and
were kindly received. —

Wednesday Dec^r 26, in
the Morning, a certain
Man came to the House, and
gave information that M^r
Havens was Dead, and M^r
Havens desired me to attend
upon his Wife's Funeral
and accordingly as soon
as the Breakfast was over
I went, and there was a
large Number of People.

Collecting, and I measured
from the woods. Got this
in Horden &c. and as soon
as the meeting was over, we
went back to Major's and
from there just at Night to
meeting House and there
was a great concourse of
People and I spoke from
Psalm CVII. 31 and it was
a solemn Assembly, and as
soon as the meeting was done
I went with one
about five miles of in a
fluy, and there lodged, &
was kindly treated

Thursday Dec 24. Some
time in the Day Peter &
Henry came to see, and
towards Night, he went
towards the South part of

Newborough, and there
we had a meeting, and
there was a great many
people and I spoke from
and the people be-
haved well, - here Brother
David Fowler came to the
meeting, just over took
us, after meeting we
went with one M^r
and then I lodged, and were
friendly entertained.

Friday Dec^r 23: took
breakfast and then after
set off and went to New Windsor
for just called on M^r Goffe
and so to M^r Wood's 4 or 5
miles out the town, and
he was very glad to see
one another, and we con-
cluded to have a meeting

in Esq^r Clark's in the even-
ing, and accordingly met
at home here approx^{ly} 72ⁿ
of people, and I spoke from
and the people
attended with great solemnity
after meeting went back
to Brother Woods, and there
was lodged.

Saturday Dec^r 29 got up
very early and took leave
of the family, and went
off in the Esq^r Clark's
and took breakfast there
and then after just again
stop a while at M^r Brewster's
in Blooming Grove took din-
ner there, after eating went
on a quin, and just in the
evening we got to Florida
and put up at M^r Robinson's,
a Tavern.

Sabb. Dec^r 31 Had an In-
vitation to preach, and I
consented, and about 11 the
People got together, and
I went into the meeting House
and there was a great number
of People, and I spoke from
and the People at-
tended with great attention -
as soon as the meeting was over
we took Dinner, and then be-
lieved on Harwich a bar of
miles, and there I preached in
the Evening to a great num-
ber of People and I spoke
from Jonah III. 5; and the P.
was very solemn, after meet-
ing I went to a certain House
and there I lodged and was
kindly treated. — — —

Monday Dec^r 31. got up very
early, and we set off, and
stopt at Col. Flatbush's and

there we took Breakfast &
soon after eating we went
on again, and some time
in the afternoon at Mr Smiths
a Publick House, and the P
desired me to stay and to have
a meeting in the evening and
I consented, and the People
got together in the evening
and there was a large number
for the cold season and short
notice. and I spoke from
and the People behaved well
in the Room, but some in the
other Room made much
Noise - we Lodged at the
same House - — —

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Tuesday Janus. 1788
got up quite early and
got ready. soon went
on our way again, and

in the evening we go^{to} Mill
Stone, and Lodged in a Pub
lick House. —

Wednesday Jan^r 2: took
Breakfast early and soon
after we set out again and
got to Soc^r Weatherston
in Princetown just about
12: took Dinner with him &
soon after we past on, and
got to a certain Tavern
and there we Lodged, and
it was very cold Night. —

Thursday Jan^r 3: we got
up very early and went on
some Time in the afternoon
we got to ~~Princetown~~ an Indian
and there we went into our
House and was there a while
found them extremely poor.
and so we went to a Tavern
and there we Lodged. —

Friday Jan^y 4th after Breakfast
left the tent & went back to the
Indian Place just call'd
in the same House we call'd
in yesterday, and to pass on
and we got to Agpeluch
another Indian Place. Call'd
at one Koyon: and I stay'd
I was very poorly with a
cold and lodg'd here the
Night following, and was
kindly treated.

Saturday Jan^y 5th: was here
again all Day. Continued
sick ill, and lodg'd here
again —

Sabb: Jan^y 6th: about 11 we
went to meeting at the meet-
ing House, and there was not
many People and it was now

pleasant Day and I spoke
from the word: that which
is wanting can not be num-
bered. and after meeting
Daniel Simon invited us to
go home with him to his Mother
in Law: Widow Calvin. and
there we have all this week
and I was much troubled with
Cold attended with Cough, —

Sabb Jan^r 13. Preached here
again, from the word: Let
thy House in order be prepared
hencey times in the whole —

Monday Jan^r 14 Left the Place
and went on toward Phila-
delphia, got to the River east
side against Philadelphia &
there we lodged in a Tavern
and rested well — —

Tuesday Jan^r 15

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Tuesday Jan 1. 1788.

We got up early and went on
our way, and got to the Red
M^r Baldwin of
and in the evening we went
to a certain House to see a sick
man, and afterwards went
back to M^r Baldwin's and there
I lodged —

Wednesday Jan 2. Some time
after breakfast, we went to
Passapatanz to M^r Green's, &
towards night went back to
M^r Baldwin's, and so to a
rather House a mile or two off
and there we had a meeting
and there was a number of
people, and I spoke to them
I was
at the same House. — met Lodge

Thursday Jan 3. We went
up early in the morning

and gone but a little way &
a Captain gentleman call'd us
and desired us to go in an
we did, and took Breakfast
with him, and gave us some
Coffees, soon after eating we
proceed on, and just past at Mr
Baldwins and to pass on, and
and went to Mr Groves, and
towards noon he went to Mr
Bennetts, and in the even
ing we had a meeting, and
there was a great Number of
People and G. spoke from
and there was great Learing
was among the People and
Learners at the same House -
Thurs Jan 11 after we broke
open left the 4th of Nov 11 &
Call at the Rev Mr Green,
and was there some minutes
and to on, and we got to Mr
Capman's at Newards mount-
tain, a little past 12 and we

took dinner here, and soon
after dinner, we went to
Crain. Town and got there
a little before ten o'clk, and
was word given out, for a
meeting here. I put up at
Mr. Perkins, and in the evening
went to meeting and there
was a great number of people
and I spoke from 1 John V. 10
and there was very great
Communion. after meeting went
back to Mr. Perkins and there
I lodged & rested well.

Saturday Jan^y 5. soon after
breakfast, we set off for
Horse Neck. and soon got
there, and it was extremely
cold, and we put up at
Coxs.

Sabb^oday Jan^y 6. about 11
we went to meeting, and it
was extremely cold, yet there

was a large Number of Peo-
ple and I spoke from
and the People attended well.
Soon as the Service was over
I went back to Capt. Currier and
there he took Dinner, and as
soon as we had swallowed
our Dinner we went off to a
rather Place, three or four
miles, and there we had
an Evening meeting and
good many People and a
well behaved People we sat
at the same House —
Monday Jan^y 8 went off
before break early, and direct-
ed our Course to Morris Town
here stop a while at Mr. Gro-
and there we left. Henry Steu-
sel, we call'd also at Doi-
Darbe, and so on, we got

Morris Tonger of Wileaford
Night, and we put up
the Rev^d M^r Jones, and
in the Evening went to the
Meeting House, and I preached
to a vast number of People
and I spoke from the words
thy Heart is not upright &c
and the People attended with
great solemnity, after meet-
ing went back with Do^r
Johnes and Lodged, —

Tuesday Jan^r 8. after eating
a bit of and went to crossing
Ridge. Stopt at Deacon
where Peter and David Lodged
and it began to rain, and
we got of, and we got to the
Place some time before noon
and we call'd in a certain
House, and about 11 we
went to attend upon a Fune-
ral of one, the Rev^d Cannon.

Daughters, and it was very
uncomfortable rainy day,
Davy said he had heard
a large number of people, and
I spoke from the words, But
the end of all things is at it
and soon after, we followed
the Corpse to the grave, and
went directly to the House
where we first put up and
there we lodge, — —

Wednesday Jan 9. after we
broke our fast we set off a
gain, and got so far as to
Mill-stone and there we
put up at a Tavern, — —

Thursday Jan 10. got up very
early and took breakfast
and soon after went on our
way, and about 12 we
arrived to Doc Whetstone's
in Prince-Town, and took

Dinner with him - and soon
after he went on again &
in the evening we put up
at Black Horse Tavern, and
it was very cold, but up some
behat beds.

Friday Jan^y 11: after eat
in the tent on again, &
got to Quakon towards Night
where there were 3 or 4 Families
of Indians, we call'd in a
one, and they appear'd ex
tremely poor. So we went
to my put up at Ten
Tavern, and it was cold yet
we got up long and I was ill
with a Cold & Cough.

Saturday Jan^y 12: after
Breakfast he got off again
and we arriv'd to Agapokwa
some time before Night, and
we stopt at Friend Noyes's
and I was very poor with

my Cold and cough'd much
up to 9. Stay'd here over Night
and was kindly treated.

Sabb. Jan 13 I felt a little
better and about 11 went to
meeting and there were not
many People there but little
Notice, and it was now a Plea-
sant Day. I spoke from the
Lover that which is waiting &
and the People attended well after
Service I went home with Daniel
Simon to his Mother in Law's House
and stay'd here all the week
Daniel Simon left on Sabbath
this week and I preach'd 2. From
Discourse from the words of
My House & and we had sing-
ing meetings every Night
and pray'd with them and
gave them a word of Exhorta-
tion.

Sabb Jan 20 Preach'd here
again and it was very bad

Travelling, and there was
a considerable number of
People collected, and I spoke
from _____ and the
People attended well, and
after meeting went back
to Widow Calvin's and in the
Evening People came together
and we had exercise both
Christian Cards, and we sang
and prayed, and it was a
solemn Time many were
much affected, and the People
were very loath to leave the
Place & they stay late —

Monday Jan^r 21: We rose
up very early and got ready
as soon as we could, and we
took leave of the Family, and
others that came to take leave
of us, and to be directed
our course to Philadelphia

and in the Evening we got
to the River against the City
and we put up in a Tavern
one Friend Cooper, —
a Tuesday Jan 22: we got up
very early, and went over
in a Boat upon the Ice, &
a little after Sun Rise we
leave in the City, and we
went to see Doc^r Duffield a
Physician, and were kindly
received, and from thence we
to see Doc^r Sprout, and he
received us kindly, and we
went on to visit Ministers of all
Denominations, and they were
all very friendly, and we
dined with gentlemen, at
most every Day. We lodge
two or three Nights at Mr
Duffield's, and there we have

invited by M^r Jones a Lawyer
a Scotchman and a good man
and the whole Family is very
agreeable he has treated
with all kindness —

Sabb. Jan^y 24 in the after-
noon. Preach'd in Dec^r
Duffield's Meeting House, in
the Evening Preach'd in Dec^r
Spruce's Meeting, and they
made Collections for me —

This week visited all week
and found kindness by all
sorts of People —

Feb 3: on Sabb in the morn-
ing Preach'd at Duffield's
in the afternoon preach'd in
a baptist meeting and there
was a large number of People —

Friday Febr 9: this evening
we were invited, with a num

number of gentlemen and
Ladies to Drink Tea with
a Dutch Captain in his
Ship, his Name was De
Horfe - and he had a gentle
entertainment - and after
Tea the Company paid the
little man, which died very
often - Stay'd till near 9 hrs
then the Indians took good
leave of the Company and
return'd to our Quarters -

Sabb Feb¹⁰ Preach'd in
the Morning in Doc^s Duffield's
Meeting, in the Evening ^{at} ~~in~~
in Currier's and they made
us a Callition -

This week went on in our use
of Cusibi amongst all sorts
of People and were kindly
treated by all People -

Sabb Feb¹¹ I went in the
Morning to Doc^s Sprout's, and

it was a Sacrament Day. Mr
Green Preach'd, and I was
took with them, and it was
a solemn Day with me, and
I believe with others. In the
after-noon I went to baptist
meeting, and heard Mr. ^{W.} ^{of the}
one of the baptist ministers in
the City.

and we were now getting
ready to leave the City, and
it was hard work to take
leave of the People that have
been so kind to us since we
have been here.

The Quakers in particular
were exceeding kind to us
and freely communicated
their substance to help our
People in the Wilderness.

Two Schools communicated
something to our Children in
the Wilderness.

Friday Feb 22 about 10
had left Philadelphia and it
was bad crossing the River, we
went on till about all the way
over and it was cold Day, and
in the Evening we got Mores Town
and Brother David was sick. &
Peter went to get a sack, and I
and Lodge in a Tavern —

Saturday Feb 23. Went to
^{to get a sack} Quakertown and got there before
noon, and put up at a Public
House in the afternoon went to
an Indian House, towards Night
went to a Public House —

Sabb. Feb 24. about 11 went
to meeting to a meeting House where
M^r Goshen Brainerd came to preach
to a Number of Indians, and there
was a considerable of People and
I spoke from Acts XI: 26 and
some time towards Night we
went to Mount Holly, got there
now dark and we put up at

Doc Proffers, and David was
very sick, and here was Days
Some Days, and I preach some
Times in this Place,

Friday Feb^{ry} 29: I left Mount
Holly and left David there he
was not well enough to sit out
and it was very cold, I got to
Trinton in the evening, call'd
at Rev^d M^r Armstrongs but
he was not at Home, so I went
to a Public House, and Lodg'd

Saturday March 1: went back
to Brandon Town got there some
Time before Night, and Lodg'd
M^r Wilsons a Baptist minister
House, but was not at Home, but
the woman treated me with all
kindness.

Sabbth March 2: and it was
extrem cold, I preach'd in a
large upper Room and there
a large number of People for
the cold season, and some

Time in the after. Noon I left
the Place and went back to
Trinton and got there before
Night, and I was to preach
here this evening, but the sen-
sors was so severe, they could
not defer it till the next Day
at 12 of the Clock in the morning
and so I went to my old Lodging
and rested comfortably
Monday March 3: about 10
we went into the meeting House
and there was a confident list
of People and I spoke from
Mark V. 12: and there was good
attention. after meeting I went
home with Mr. Amstong and
dined with, and some time
in the after noon I went back
to Irons Bridge and there I
had an evening meeting and
there was a vast number of
People, and I spoke from Sol.
Lang VIII. 5 and it was a solemn
time. — I Lodged at the same
House.

Tuesday March 4: David &
I set off pretty early, and
we got to and Lodg
at South Tower,

Wednesday March 5: We got
up early and got Victuals &
soon after set off, and we got
almost to New Brunswick
and David said he had forgot
his bundle, and so he went
back and I went on, got to
N. Brunswick before noon
and I put up at a Publick,
and then went to see the Rev
Mr. Monteck, and then I din'd
with him, after Dinner we
went to see Dr. Scott, and I was
receiv'd with all kindness, and
here I found Peter, who had
been struggling from us along
a fortnight, and presently after
David came up with me, and

and in the evening there
was a Society, and we went
to it, and I spoke a few
words by way of Exhortation
and after meeting we retired
to Doc^r. Scotts and there we
Lodged -

Thursday March 6th got up
early and went to General
Houses. on visiting, and was
very treated kindly, Dined
with a Dutch Minister, and
was exceedingly friendly
in the evening we had a meet-
ing in the Presby^{terian} meet-
ing House and there was a
large Number of People, and
I spoke from
I Lodged at Doc^r. Scotts again
and David and Peter Lodged
in another House -

Friday March 7th we got
up early and went to take

Breakfast with a certain
gentleman and soon after
breakfast he went back
to Doc^r Smith and got ready
about 9. he took leave of
Doc^r. Scott and his Family
and others and went on
our way, and we stopt at
the Red M^o in
Woodbridge and took dinner
there, and soon after eating
we past on, and we got
to Elizabeth Town just be-
fore sunset, and we call'd
upon Bro^r Woodroffs a few
minutes, and went on to N.
York, and we got there some
time in the evening and
we stopt at a Publick House
I went to Doc^r M^r Warrtens &
but was not well and did not
see him, and so went back
to the Tavern — —

Saturday March 8: got up
very early, and got ready
and went on our way to
Newark morning, got there
about 9: and call'd on M^r
Chapman and took breakfast
left there, and M^r Chapman
was very sick and he was
to visit town and I got up
a dinner for him, and we
were most kindly entertained
David and Peter lodg'd in another
M^r Grains House

Sabb. March 9: about 9 went
to Meeting got to the Place as the
People began to collect, and
there was a very large Number
of People and I preached till
Day from Mark v. 4.
and the People attended with
great solemnity, - The Rev^d M^r
Chapman went to Newark
to preach, - and in the evening

I had a meeting to attend
upon in New York and there
was a vast Number of People
and I spoke II Corin XVII: 22
and the People were very solemn
and I went with Dr. Bunn
and lodged there and I did
Lodge in the Publick House
I went to bed soon —

Monday March 10 went
to the Place all Day, and in
the Evening I preached again
to a multitude of People and
I spoke from
and the People attended with
all gravity after meeting I
went home with Doctor Bunn
again, and there lodged —

Tuesday March 11. Some
in the morning we took leave
of our Friends and went on
our way towards New York
got over there some Time in

the afternoon and we
went up at the North point
of the City with one
"Savane" heepon

Wednesday March 12: went
to visit on Doc Rodger
and other gentlemen upon
our business, but there was
no prospect of doing much.
The good Friend or Quaker
did more than any they gave
David and Peter (Seymour?)
to bear their expenses to Orinda
and they gave some other things
to our People in the Woods.

Friday March 14 Brother
Seymour, Fowler and Peter
Pohjosen departed left me
at New York and they re-
turned homeward to Orinda
Saturday March 15: in the
Evening I preached in Missions
meeting House, and a Petre

was a large number of People
and I spoke from
and the People attended well
Some with affection —

Sabb. March 16. in the morn-
ing went to hear Dr. Proctor,
Chel. I was disappointed, I heard
M^r. Miller. from some part
of the New Jersey — in the
after noon I went to hear the
Methodists, and I heard a young
man but was not extraordinary
in the evening went to my
bedding —

Wednesday March 17: Some
a boat took a passage in a
boat to Elizabethtown, got
there just here lit, and I put
up at a Publick House with
one M^r. — a Religious
man and was kindly treated
by him & his Lady —

Thursday March 20: in the
morning some Time, M^r

took me in his Carriage, and
he went to Newark to see a
Country Money that was to be
sent, Mr. Rodgers in New York
for me; he got there too, but
I could not know a bout, I call'd
on Mr. M^r Water, in the evening
went back but I stop'd
at one Mr. Lyon, and lodged
there we had a meeting this
evening in a Baptist Meeting
House. This Place is call'd
Lyon's Tavern.

Tuesday March 22: in
the Evening I heard Mr. Syden
in Elizabeth Town Church and
he is a good Preacher of the
gospel of Jesus Christ. Lodg'd
at my old Quarters

Wednesday March 23 Preach'd
all Day in the Presbyterian
meeting House and there was
a large number of People
I spoke from

in the evening I attended
a Society, gave a word of exhor-
tation, and Lodged at the
Same House -

Monday 24. early in the
morning went to a certain
Place 5 or 6 miles southward
and preached in a certain M.
House, and the Rev. Mr. Gordon
was present, and there was
a great Number of People
tho' it was very cold, and as
soon as I had done speaking
Mr. Gordon gave a word of
Exhortation, and there was
great solemnity amongst
the People. I spoke from
Psalms CVII: 31. Some time
after meeting I went with
a Lady in her Coach, to
her House, and from thence
to another House, and in
the evening went to another
and there I preached to a large

Congregation and I spoke
from _____ and the
People many of them were
much affected. I Lodged at
the _____ House,

Tuesday March 25 got up
very early, and got ahead, and
a Negro carried me in a
wage to Elizabeth Town, and
from there Esq Woodruff car-
ried in his Chaise, to the Point
and had a passage direct to
New York about 12, and
went directly to Dr Radgors
to see whether my Money had
got there, but it was not, and
so immediately went to Personal
Ferry and went over, and
took Stage Wagon, and went
at Newark before ten to
and there I found my Money
at Mr Ogden's, and so I went

to Dr. Marmonten and he
was not at Home, and I went
to bed soon being much wearied
the fatigues of the Day, and
"Some Time in the Evening the
Dr. came Home, and he came
into the Room where I lay,
and he was much surpris'd
to see me in bed, he know'd not
I was in the House

Wednesday March 26: got
up tolerably and went to
Mr. Jons, to Lagaunt my
Money, for it was chiefly in
Gardner's Bill, and Express, &
I had to go in Stage Waggons
again, but I was too late,
and went to the Landing, and
happily found a Stage going
to New York, and I with you
went aboard, and was at
New York before Night, &
went to my Lodging house

we took breakfast, the family
was very kind to us, — and we
were very soon called to go aboard
a yacht, and sailed on for Na-
puck and we arrived there be-
