Monday Dec<sup>r</sup> 11, <sup>1786</sup> About 12  
I took leave of Bro<sup>r</sup> Woodworth's  
Family, and went on to North  
Town, got to M<sup>r</sup> Tobias,  
Aft<sup>r</sup> he gave me sit and  
I enied there, and was very  
kindly intertained, by the Family  
Lodged there. —

Tuesday Dec<sup>r</sup> 12: about 11  
the People began to collect  
and there was Company of  
People, for the Season, it was  
very cold, and much snow  
on the Ground, and it was  
Scattered Snow, — he began  
the meeting, a little after 12  
I Spoke from Matt, VI. 10 and  
the People attended with great  
and solemn attention, many  
were much affected, — I Lodg

here again, and had a com-  
fortable rest. — —

Wednesday Dec: 13: Got up  
early, and set off soon, left  
at Mr. Robinsons a while  
took these, and soon after  
breakfast. I went on again,  
got to Exr. Sherman's, about  
11: and took dinner with them  
Soon after dinner, went over  
to Mr. Dimon's, and found  
them well, and was kindly  
received, especially by  
Mrs. Dimon, she is an old  
acquaintance, and friend  
of mine, she came from  
Rhode Island State, lodged  
there, and was very tenderly  
entertained, lodged comfort-  
ably by the Fire, and of

to my office, — — —

Thursday Dec<sup>r</sup> 14: About 10  
we went to Dr<sup>s</sup> Sherman<sup>s</sup>  
to meeting, the People got  
together at 11, and I went  
into a Store House, where the  
People collected, and there  
was a prodigious Concourse  
of People. I spoke from the  
Revel. of John 1: Chap 1: 36  
and there was a melting  
attention amongst the People  
many tears were shed, and  
presently after meeting I  
went home again with  
M<sup>r</sup> Simond and his Family  
in their Sled, and there  
I Lodged again. — —

Friday Dec<sup>r</sup> 15. got up very  
early, and the whole Family got  
up, also, and Breakfast  
was got ready soon, and we ate

and soon after eating Mr  
Demond and his wife, and I  
went to Stephen Town in his  
Chay, it is about 10 miles distant  
we stopt at Mr Jacey Spencers  
a little while, and suprest on, and  
about 10 o. & we got to Mr Nu-  
tham Brookways, and there we  
put up, he was not at Home,  
and towards Night, he got home  
and in the Evening, the People col-  
lected together for meeting, and  
there was a large Assembly, and  
I spoke from XXV Matt. 19: and the  
People attended with great solemn-  
ity, many were affected much,  
and after meeting, many spoke  
to me with tenderness, after the  
People were gone we sung several  
Hymns, and had agreeable Conver-  
sation, got up very late, and last  
went to bed quietly -  
Saturday Dec 16: got up early  
and had Exercise in the Family

with my sword, and the young I  
attend with gravity and decency  
and some time after break  
fast he set off again, to return  
to Philips-Town. got to Mr Dimond's  
House, about 6. and there stay'd  
again.

Sabb Dec<sup>r</sup> 17. about 10 he  
went to meeting at Exp<sup>r</sup> John  
Schoenmarkhorn's and there was  
the biggest number of People, that  
ever was seen in one meeting  
in this Wilderness Settlement, it  
was thought there was about 500  
People, We met in a large  
Hall, - I Spoke from Amos  
111. 4, and I think I had some  
sense of Divine things, and there  
was an affectionate attention  
thro the Assembly, the People  
were bow'd under the word, they  
set like Criminals, under a  
Sentence of Death - Soon after

meeting I returned with Mr  
Dimond and his Family in a  
Stage. In the evening a Congrega-  
tion came together, at Mr Dimond's  
for meeting, there were but few  
People, it was a tedious Snow  
and Rainy evening, I spoke  
from John 19: and the People  
assembled with great solemnity  
Some were affected. —

Monday Dec<sup>r</sup> 18. Soon after  
breakfast Mr Dimond got his  
Stage ready, and went Mr  
Samuel Wheeler's to meeting  
about 5 miles, we got there  
about 11, and the People  
just began to collect, and then  
considerable of People got toge-  
ther, I spoke from Matt 5.  
and it was a solemn meeting,  
Soon after meeting, he went

went back, got home before  
sun set, and Lodged there —  
Tuesday Dec<sup>r</sup> 19: got up  
very early, and they got  
breakfast directly, before  
sun rise. I took leave of the  
family, and went on my to  
Stephen Town; called at Mr  
Spencers, at Mr Jones, and  
so on to Mr Joshua Gardner  
and there was a goodly  
Number of People collected  
together, and I began the  
Service directly, I spoke  
from Luke 1: 15: and there  
was very deep and solemn at-  
tention thro the Assembly,  
many Tears were shed; —  
soon after took Dinner  
and then went with one



Mr. Ezekiel Sheldon, and  
had an evening meeting there  
and there was a considerable  
of people I spoke from <sup>with</sup> ~~the~~  
the people seemed to attend  
with some feeling of the word  
after I had done two or three  
I spoke with some affection,  
I was tenderly treated. Lodged  
at the same House, and was  
comfortably, about  
Wednesday Decr 20. About 10  
we went to one Hammers to  
meeting, and there was a large  
number of people, and I  
spoke from John VIII. 37 and  
there was attention soon after  
meeting, I we went back with  
Mr. Sheldon again in his day  
took dinner with them, and  
directly after eating, we went  
to one Mr. Hayward, and there  
we had another meeting.

I spoke from Mark vi 4  
and the People attended well,  
one or two spoke after I had,  
have ~~been~~ -  
Thursday Dec<sup>r</sup> 21. After Pt  
Mr. Princes Price and I went  
to Mr. Brockway's, and Mr.  
Price went back, and Mr.  
Brockway took me in his  
Stage, with his Family, to a meet-  
ing about 3 miles northward  
abt that or 12: and a large  
Number of People had col-  
lected together, and I began  
the exercise directly, I spoke  
from John vi 36: and there was  
an <sup>it</sup> common attention among  
the People, there was a flow  
of Tears, I believe the Lord  
was present with his Word,  
as soon as ever the meeting  
was done, I went back with  
Mr. Brockway, - and in the

Evening we had meeting  
again and there was a  
Terrible Number of People &  
I Spoke from 1 Peter  
and the People attended with  
great solemnity. Lodged at the  
Same House — — —

Friday Dec<sup>r</sup> 22, Soon after  
Breakfast, I leave of the S<sup>r</sup>  
and went on to one Mr Gard  
ners, upon the borders of  
Hancock, and there was  
a meeting to be, the People  
began to collect when I got  
there, and there was a large  
Number of People. I began  
about half after 11. I spoke  
from Acts VIII. and they  
were greatly attentive and  
some manifested affection

Soon after meeting I went  
home with M<sup>rs</sup> Goodrich and  
her son in a Stage, got there  
some time before night the  
Place where they live is call'd  
Garicho; tooke Dinner with  
them, the man of the House  
is helples as a Child, he is  
troubled with a Hum Puffe,  
in the Evening, we went in the  
Stage again to meeting at the  
House of one M<sup>r</sup> Hammond, and  
there was great many People.  
I spoke four  
and the People appeared  
very serious and some were  
afflicted. Soon after meeting  
went back with M<sup>rs</sup> Goodrich  
and there I Lodg, and was  
kindly treated, — —

Saturday Dec. 23: Soon af-  
ter eating, took leave of  
the Family, and went on to  
nearby New Lebanon; Stopt  
a while at Mr. Pritchins  
his wife has been sick a  
long while. I had some con-  
versation with her, she com-  
plains of much Darkness,  
but I believe she is a real  
Christian; about 11: I went  
on, a man went with me,  
and he conducted to the Pool  
and it is a remarkable  
Spring, and a Group of  
Houses are on and round,  
near them but few minutes  
and I went on to the meeting  
House, and I put up at  
Capt Jones's Close by the river

ing House, and he and his  
Wife were not at Home  
in the evening they came home  
and they are a agreeable Couple  
Lodged there were was kindly  
entertained. — — —

Sabb. Dec<sup>r</sup> 24: It was a very  
Cold Day. I went into the meet-  
ing House, about 11: and there  
was a considerable number of  
People for the Cold Season. I spoke  
from the words there is at Jerusa<sup>m</sup>  
a Fool, &c. and there was a  
good attention. after meeting  
went to Capt Jones's again.  
in the evening went to one Mr  
Abot's and there he had a meeting  
and there was a great number  
of People, and I spoke from  
1 Corin VII: and there was a  
solemn attention. many I be-  
lieve were much affected —

after meeting I went back to  
Capt Jones, and Lodged there a  
gain, - - - - -

Monday Dec 25: got up  
very early, and took Break  
and set out early and got to  
Richmond, in Barb<sup>y</sup>: Calld  
on M<sup>r</sup> Perry a minister of  
the Pl. w<sup>ch</sup>, and he and ano-  
ther man, were very urgent  
to have me stop and preach  
in the evening, and I consented  
and I went to M<sup>r</sup> Miller, and  
there I put up, in the evening  
we went to meeting to M<sup>r</sup> Collins  
and there was a considerable  
number of people, and I spoke  
from 1 Kings 19: and the  
people attended well. I Lodged  
at the same House and they  
were exceed kind to me.

Tuesday Dec 26. got up very  
early, and they got breakfast  
soon, and had had dinner with  
my land. and it was very  
agreeable to them, a boat of  
9 got off, a young woman  
me a day to Mr Miller, and  
a boat of 9. I got away again  
got to Stockholm before  
12: took dinner with Mr. for  
gent, and then went Capt  
Gooker, and he was not at  
Home, and so I went back  
to one Lurefha, and in  
the evening went back to  
Capt Gooker, and lodged  
there, they being very glad  
to see me, —

Wednesday Dec 27. got up  
very early, and a little of  
the sunrise. I went on my



Monday, got to Mr Babcock's  
in Laramie, and Lodged  
there.

Thursday Dec<sup>r</sup> 28. got up  
quite early. Got a wrap, and  
went at General Hartses;  
got to Mr Enos before sun  
set, and put up there.

Friday Dec<sup>r</sup> 29. got up  
very early and got breakfast  
left, and got off soon, got  
to Mr Sabins before noon  
and they desired me to stay  
over the Sabbath, and I con-  
sented, and Lodged there.

Sabb. Dec<sup>r</sup> 31. about 10 the  
People began to collect, and  
there were considerable num-  
ber of People, and I began  
about 11. Spoke from Amos, 5:3

and the People attended very  
well, but not so solemn  
as I have seen in other  
Places. - Took Dinner after  
meeting; and some time  
in the afternoon, I got off  
and got to E. of Roberts, in  
the evening, and he desired  
me to tarry all night with him  
and I accepted of his kind  
offer, and I went to bed soon  
and rested comfortably -

Thus I have ended one year  
more, and have experienced  
much of the goodness of God  
to me in many respects, tho'  
I have been greatly and thank-  
fully wanting in my Duty  
to myself, to my fellow Creatures,  
and to my Maker, - O God  
Almighty, freely pardon all my

Wittenburg Jan<sup>r</sup> 5 1787

In the morning, we had  
Exercise, in the Family  
and it was very agreeable  
to them, they were very solemn  
and I pray'd in the Family.

Some Time in the Morning  
M<sup>r</sup> Walcutt came, to the <sup>the</sup> ~~the~~  
house I was, invit'd to his  
House, he is the Minister of  
the Place, and the People  
had concluded, to have me  
Preach on the next Day;

and some Time past Noon  
I left Esq<sup>r</sup> Robert's and  
went to see M<sup>r</sup> Samuel Cro  
I call'd by the way at M<sup>r</sup>  
Fellay's, they were exceeding  
glad to see me, and they  
sent for Deacon Manley

and he soon came he is an  
old Disciple, appears to be  
an Israelite indeed, and has  
had agreeable interviews  
after awhile, I went on  
and saw Mr. Enb., he and  
his wife were glad to see  
me, - Just at Night I  
went to Mr. Wolcott, and  
was kindly received & received.  
Thus I began a New Year  
The Lord enable me to  
Live a New Life more  
than ever I did, that I  
might Live as a Dying  
and accountable Creature  
unto God. The Lord enable  
me to do what ever work  
I have before me; and that  
I might resign myself into  
the Hands of God -

Free day Jan<sup>y</sup> 2. Near 18  
M<sup>r</sup> Wolcott and I went to  
meeting, and we found but  
few people at the meeting.  
Sat a while in a House, and  
a little past 11. went into the  
meeting House and there  
was considerable Number  
of People got together, and  
I spoke from Daniel 4:23  
and there was deep attention  
many were much affected,  
Soon after meeting, I went  
into an House, and took Din-  
ner, and then I went on and  
call on M<sup>r</sup> Rowland at old  
Windsor. Sat but few minutes,  
and past on, got over the  
River well, and went to see  
Daughter Olive's, got there  
in the Dusk of the evening  
and found them all well.

Lodged there; got up late -  
Wednesday Jan 3. got up  
early, and took few months  
full of Victuals, and to wait  
on my way; Call on Mr  
Ralston at Bolton, a minist  
ter of the Place, and he was  
exceeding glad to hear of  
the work of god in the wilder  
ness, amongst the Indians,  
took Dinner, and soon after  
setting, I went on again, &  
I got to favour Mr Louis in  
Lebanon, a Tavern keeper  
went to Bed pretty soon, and  
rested comfortably - -  
Thursday Jan 4. got up  
early, and set off directly  
and it has been here ride  
ing, it had been thawing  
snow since last Saturday

Stopt at Capt Hidge's, and there  
took breakfast, and soon after  
eating I went on my way. Stop  
a little while at Mr Chapman's  
and there I heard a Surprising  
News. that one of my kins  
had been guilty of murder  
near Boston, and was sen-  
tenced to be hung, and my  
wife has been there about  
three weeks ago, and was  
mourning and weeping her-  
self almost to Death, and I  
was somewhat surpris'd &  
began to think many things  
but when I got in Town, I  
found there was nothing in  
it; about 2. in the after-  
noon, I got home, and  
found my dear Family  
all in good State of Health  
Bless'd be the Name of the  
Lord

Sabb Jan<sup>y</sup>: went to meeting  
to Deacon Henry Quasigen's,  
but there was but very few  
people, and I only gave  
them the relation of my jour-  
ney, and prayed, —

Thursday Jan<sup>y</sup> 11: my wife  
was rob'd by a Mobatto —

Friday Jan<sup>y</sup> 19 The above  
mentioned Mattalo was tried  
before two justices, and was  
found guilty —

Saturday Jan<sup>y</sup> 20: went to  
Lower part of Groton, went  
over the River at New London  
got to Capt Robert Latham's  
a little before Sun set, and  
found them all well, and was  
kindly received, and lodg'd  
there, and went to bed soon  
and rested comfortably —



Sabb. Jan<sup>y</sup> 21. It was a stormy  
Day and was all night  
about 10 went Meeting at Mr.  
Gideon Saunders, and there  
was but a little number of  
People, and I spoke to them  
from James 11. 26  
in the evening went to Mr.  
Abel Babcock's and had  
a meeting there; and there  
was a large number of P.  
and I spoke from James 14: 4  
and the People attended with  
great attention; I lodged at  
the same house,

Monday Jan<sup>y</sup> 22. Soon after  
Breakfast, went back to Mr.  
Saunders, and was there  
but a little while, and then  
went to see Mr. Latham, for  
a little while, and so went on

to Mr. Streets, Call'd at Mr.  
Woods, near there a while &  
then went to Mr. Streets, and  
was kindly receiv'd by the Fam-  
ily, about 1/2 beg in the M<sup>o</sup> of  
and there was considerable  
Number of People, tho' it  
was a Snowy Day, and  
I spoke from Rom. 11. 28:19  
and the People attend'd well  
after meeting took dinner  
at the same House, - and  
in the Evening went to Mr.  
Leffers and had another  
meeting, and there was  
a great Number of Peop<sup>le</sup>  
tho' the Storm continu'd, &  
I spoke from James. 7  
and the People attend'd with  
great solemnity, - I Lodg'd  
at the same House - - -

Tuesday Jan<sup>r</sup> 23: Some Time  
after Breakfast, I took leave  
of the Family; and went  
to Capt Robert Latham, &  
took leave of them, and then  
went down to the Ferry, and  
went over to New London  
and was there some Hours  
and so past on, and got  
Home some Time before  
Night, and found all  
my Family well, thro  
the goodness of God. —

Saturday Jan<sup>r</sup> 27: About 10.  
Took of my Home, and went  
to a Place call'd Jewet City  
got there some Time before  
Sun set, put up at Mr Deans  
Jewet and was kindly re-  
ceiv'd up some what late  
and rested comfortably —

Sabb Jan<sup>r</sup> 28<sup>th</sup>. A little  
past 11 went into the most  
ing, and there was a great  
Number of People, and  
I spoke from Rom 11:28.29  
and there was a solemn at-  
tention in the Assembly,  
after Service went to Mr Jewe  
and took Dinner there, and  
soon after Dinner took leave  
of the Family, and went  
to Deacon Tracy's, and there  
had a meeting again  
and there was a great  
Number of People, I spoke  
from 1 Sam XII:24. and there  
was a solemn attention,  
many shed Tears, - Lodged  
at the same House, and  
rested comfortably -

Monday Jan<sup>r</sup> 29, got up  
early, and had my horse  
got ready soon, and then  
on my way, stop at  
one Mr. Pades and took  
breakfast there, and af-  
ter eating, had some con-  
versation with an old  
woman, 92 years of age  
or near, and had a little  
conversation with a <sup>family</sup> family  
and another family (she  
to the house, - and then  
went on, got home about  
2 o'clock, and found my horse  
well as common

Sabb. Febr<sup>y</sup> 4. About 11  
set off from home, and to Mr.  
Fisher and it was a severe  
cold, wind blew very hard

at North West, and snow  
flew like fog, - got <sup>to</sup> the

people, more than could be  
expected for the severity  
of the weather. I began  
the Exercise about 12 or past  
I spoke from Delefi. 111, 12

tention - after service took

Left home early in the mor-  
ning, and to one Mr. Smith  
in Newent, Stopt a while  
at Dr. Maff's in Norwich  
and took breakfast there  
and soon after went on, and  
to Mr. Smith's about 10 and

they were glad to see me,  
the old gentleman is quite  
helpless with Nerve Palsy  
and about half after 10 o'clock  
I began the meeting and  
there were but few people.  
I spoke from Job: XXXV. 10  
and the people attended  
with great solemnity.

Soon after meeting I  
went back and got home  
in the dusk of the evening  
and was somewhat tired  
and went to bed soon —

Saturday Febr<sup>y</sup> 10: About 12  
I set off from my house and  
to Colonel Ingham's town. Got  
there about Sun. set, and put  
at Widow Pugh's room, and  
found them all well, and we  
were glad to see each other.

again once more this side  
of the grave, went to bed in  
good season, and had a com-  
fortable rest, —

Sabb. Feb<sup>ry</sup> 11: we began  
the Meeting near 12: but there  
was considerable Number of  
People, and I spoke from,  
1 Peter IV. 8. and the People at-  
tended well, — in the evening  
we had another meeting, and  
considerable number of People  
for it was a rainy evening,  
and I spoke from 1 King. XXI. 29  
and I had but a little sense of  
Divine things, yet the People at-  
tended well, — We sat up a long  
while and sang, W. S. Spicer  
Lodg there, and many of the  
Indians, went to bed at last, &  
I rested well, —

Monday Febru<sup>ry</sup> 12: Got up



and attended our Family Pray  
and then got of soon, & slept  
white at Mr John Williams, and  
took breakfast here, and soon  
after eating went on my  
way, got home, and little pay  
work and found my Family  
all well as usual.

Friday, Feb<sup>r</sup> 16: Towards N  
went to Mr Chappels, and as many  
there, but few People got toge  
ther, and I spoke to them from  
Psalm 146: 5, and the People at  
tended soberly, stayed at the  
House all Night, we got up late  
yet had comfortable Rest by  
Sleep in the silent watches.

Monday Feb<sup>r</sup> 17: got up  
early, and they breakfast  
soon, and I eat with them  
and soon after went Home  
and slept a while at Mr J.  
Avery's, got home about 11-

Saturday Feb<sup>r</sup> 24. Sun a  
bait on Hour high, got off from  
home and went to Canterbury  
Call'd on Jas<sup>r</sup> Moush, and staid  
a while and past on, and  
got Brother Clarke, some  
time in the afternoon, and  
found them all well, and  
was kindly received; and  
Lodg'd there,

Sabb. Feb<sup>r</sup> 25. Soon after  
Breakfast, went to meet  
ing, in Scotland, M<sup>r</sup> Palm<sup>er</sup>  
Meeting House, and there  
was but a little number  
of People; I spoke to them  
from Prov: N: 13: and in  
the afternoon from Palm<sup>er</sup>  
Directly after meeting I  
went back to M<sup>r</sup> Isaac's<sup>W<sup>m</sup></sup>  
and had a meeting there  
in the evening and there

as a large Number of  
People, and I spoke from  
Luke XXIII:40 and there was  
good attention, and so there  
in the Socy. Lodge at the  
same House, and kind signs  
certains, went to bed some  
what late and had some  
comfortable rest -

Monday Feb 26. Got up  
very early, stop a few  
minutes at Mr Lions and  
to pass on, stop at Mr  
Joseph Smiths, and there  
took Breakfast, and soon  
after eating went on and  
got home about 12: and  
found my Family well  
Thanks to the Father of  
all mercies -

Sabb. March 10. Some Time  
in the Morning set off from Home  
and went over to Gratton, and  
it was very bad riding, turn  
near some what deep, and soft  
too, and it snowed, so we  
got to Mr Chapman about  
11, and the People began to  
gather, and there was consi-  
derable number of People  
and he began the meeting  
about 12 and I spoke from  
James IV. 14: and there was  
Solomon attention - after  
took Dinner with the family  
and soon after eating, set off  
for Home, got home before  
Sun Down.

Sabb. March 11. Got up  
some Time before Daybreak  
and heur getting to go up to  
Dunstable, set off a little  
after Sun rise, stop a few  
minutes at Dr. Mearns,

and so professed, called at  
M<sup>r</sup> Smith's also, and took  
some victuals, and so we  
got to Elder Lyon's room  
12: and he directly sent  
out among the Neighbours  
to give notice of my be-  
ing in the Place, and  
the People collected soon  
and about 1: we began  
the Service of God, - and  
I spoke from Matt. 5:  
and the People attended  
with great solemnity.  
after meeting took Dinner  
with Brother Lyon, just  
before Night. We went to  
M<sup>r</sup> Dyer's Braaster, and  
there we had another  
meeting, and there was  
considerable number of  
People; and I spoke from

Math VI: 9: and the Lord I  
believe was present with  
us; the Hearts of some Chris-  
tians were warmed with the  
Trove of Love. Some delivered  
few words after I had done  
& Lodged at the same House  
and was entertained with  
Brotherly kindness, rested  
comfortably; — —

Monday March 12: after  
breakfast, I went to see  
Brother Sinsummon, found  
all well. about 10 went  
to see, and soon to Mr. Parris  
took Dinner with them,  
from thence we went to  
Brother Jarvis's meeting.  
about 2 began the meeting,  
and there was a great number  
of people; and I spoke from  
1 Corin VIII 29-30 and I believe  
the Lord was present with hi

word, many of the People here  
Wor'd some rejoiced and others  
were bowed under the word  
many Trews here. Tho. Brother  
Lyon was so full he quite  
gave over, and he kiss'd us  
all with a kiss of Charity  
not with his mouth, but with  
his Heart, - stayed at the  
Tame House all Night, -

Tuesday March 13. It was  
a stormy Morning it rained  
every hour, and so stay'd qui-  
etly had a pebble entertain  
ment both with victuals and  
Drink and Conversation. Both  
Dinner with them, and the main  
Pluck, and so I set off for home,  
stopt a while at M<sup>r</sup> Joseph  
Smiths, Prayed with them, and  
went on my way, got home  
just after dark set.

Friday March 16. Went to  
New London on the Trebe,

Business to see the Seeds of  
Mr John Raymond, and Mr  
Choncyer Smith Jr. I found  
Smiths, but could not find Ray  
got home again in some Time in  
the evening.

Sabb March 18: Went to Mr  
John Browns, call'd on Dr  
Rogers, and sat there a while  
and then went on, got to the  
Place, about 10. and had be-  
gan the meeting near 12: and  
there was considerable num  
of People, for a wet Day  
and I spoke from Hosea IV. 1

ton and lodged at Mr  
Lesters and was kindly

Saturday April 7. got  
up very early and went  
down to the Ferry, called  
on Esq Leary and  
he desired me to take  
breakfast there, but  
I was in haste and the  
booman gave me a good hunt

of bread and meat and  
went directly over, and a  
Cout I had hot sail again  
and had small and contrary  
wy. and we were obliged  
to run into Red Hook, &  
there we spent the Night  
and I lodged a board —
