at 10 o'clock as the meeting was  
over I went off to Bulltown  
got to Mr. Looys about four  
down, and it was raining yet  
a number of people came to  
gather, and we had a very  
pleasant evening with my notes, set up

Saturday Dec<sup>r</sup> 14: in the  
morning went to Mr. Jeremiah  
Sealers and took breakfast  
with them, and soon after  
eating I went off, called on  
at Mr. Benjamin, and from  
there went to Mr. Looys a  
Dutchman, and was extremely  
well received, stayed the  
most of the day and the night  
ensuing, and was here  
very agreeable exercise both

Sabb Dec<sup>r</sup> 18 Soon after  
Breakfast Mr Gundy and  
I went to Bullaway to meet  
ing with the Scotch People  
We got there about 12: and  
there was a great Number of  
People, chiefly Scotch People, and  
I began the meeting soon after  
I got there, I spoke from <sup>vi. 114</sup> Ep<sup>l</sup>  
and I much pleased; and there  
was long deep and solemn atten-  
tion, many were greatly affected.  
after Service, I took Dinner with  
the Family where the meeting, the  
meat Name was M<sup>r</sup>. M<sup>r</sup> Hingler,  
Soon after Dinner, I returned  
to Ross River, I went alone, I got  
to M<sup>r</sup>. Moorhouse's before Sun-  
set, and staid there for the night  
and was affectionately received.  
in the Evening a number of

Young People and some others  
Came together, to have Exercises  
with my Notes, and it was  
or it was a comfortable meet-  
ing, the Company broke up  
about 10, and after that we  
got up some time, and we  
went to Bed quickly. —

Monday Dec<sup>r</sup> 19. got very  
early, and got my Mare shod  
and after breakfast, I took  
good leave of the Family, and  
got of to take leave of my other  
Friends as soon as I could, for  
a journey came for me this  
morning, to go to North part  
of Bull's Town 8 or 9 miles  
from this Place, got a word  
from my Friends about 12  
and to went on as fast as  
I could, called at Mr. Seeley's  
and took Dinner there, and

to present directly on a given  
go to the Place be I, and Mar-  
ried a Couple of English, their  
Names were, Sanford White &  
Hannah Hide - In the evening  
I went to another House one Mr.  
Smith's and there we had a meet-  
ing, and there was a goodly  
Number of People, and it was  
a refreshing meeting, many  
I believe felt the Power of the  
Word, I spoke from Luke VIII  
after I had dismissed them, a man  
had stayed, and desired to have  
Exercise with my Notes, and  
there was great solemnity a-  
mongst them, many were  
deeply affected, there was a  
flow of Tears, from many Eyes  
it was late before we broke  
up, and I went to bed well  
made in Peace, thank, be  
to God -

Tuesday Dec 20. got up very  
Early and had my Horse get  
for me, and went one m<sup>ile</sup>  
instead of a few Rods and there  
took breakfast. after break  
fast took my notes hands out  
to B. on 4: children, and then  
I got off for Eastward, got to  
M<sup>r</sup> Woods about 12: took din  
ner with them, and soon after  
Dinner went on again one  
M<sup>r</sup> Nash conducted me over  
the North End of the Lake -  
and M<sup>r</sup> Nash desired me to  
go home with him and to  
have a meeting in the evening  
at his house or some other  
and I consented and we had  
a meeting, and there was  
great number of people  
I spoke from, Hebrews 11: To what  
purpose &c - Lodged at M<sup>r</sup> Nashs

Wednesday Dec: 21. Was up  
early, and got ready to go  
away, and Mr. Nash had a  
notion of exchanging money  
with me, and I Confess'd of  
it a little while, and conclud  
ed to swap with him, and  
he took off my saddle put it  
the other, I gave him 2 Dollars  
and an half, and I so I w<sup>ent</sup>  
out to M<sup>r</sup> Bilson's and took Bran  
and soon after breakfast I  
went on again; I just now  
heard Brother David, had good  
luck in selling his roots, &  
had success with the Honorable  
Congress, in his memorial  
for help; - I got to Cay's Debar  
near a little while before  
dusk, found them all well



and was kindly received by  
them, - took Dinner at Mr  
Gregorys, - In the Evening I  
went to Mr Gregorys to meeting  
and there heard a long and  
clear of People, tho it was exceed-  
ing bad Travelling both on  
horse back and foot. - I spoke  
from Isaiah 1: To what purpose  
and I think I had some sense  
of Divine things the Power of  
the Word, - Lodged at Mr Gre-  
gorys

Thursday Dec 22: after  
Breakfast some time I went  
to Capt Dunning. Stay till  
after Dinner. and then took  
leave of the Family, and  
took of for New-Town, Capt  
Dunning went with me a  
bout 2 or 3 half miles, and

and then a hind Dutch  
man conducted me, till he  
got me to a plain way, and  
I got to Mr. Tailor, and was  
enquiring where the People  
meet together to worship and  
he said they had no meeting  
and he sent me out at last  
that I was a Preacher, and  
refused me to fight, and I  
did, he was a very kind to me  
and to my name, and I left  
them. - Rested very comfort-  
ably.

Friday Dec 23: got me  
up some time before day  
and made me up a fire, &  
got down by it - and here  
I stay till some time in the  
afternoon, and then I went  
to a Still Water, got to Mr.

Bakers, before sun set, and in  
the Evening a number of People  
Came in, and M<sup>r</sup> Maugh and  
then amongst this People came  
in also, and we had Conversa-  
tion some was not so agreeable  
before we broke up we had  
some Exercise with me, notes  
and it was late before we had  
done, Lodg<sup>d</sup> here, —

Saturday Dec<sup>r</sup> 24. Toward  
noon I went to see M<sup>r</sup> Campbell  
and took dinner with them,  
Soon after Dinner, I went  
off to go back to New-Town  
Call'd at M<sup>r</sup> Andrews, but  
he was not at Home, and I  
went on, - Stopt at S<sup>r</sup> M<sup>r</sup> Miller  
and there I tarried all night  
and was kindly entertain'd  
went to bed pretty early, —

Sabb. Dec 25: got up some  
Time before Break of Day  
and the Family got up. We  
and they got Breakfast soon  
and a little after Sun rise  
we were getting ready to go  
to meeting, - with Mr Taylor  
and I went of town, and to  
his Sun's good while before  
meeting, about 11: the People  
began to flock in fast, and  
about 12 we began the  
service, and there was a pro-  
digious Number of People  
Collected together, and I spoke  
from Luke 11. 10; and there  
was very great attention -  
and in the Evening we had a  
nother meeting, and there was  
a large number of People there.

it was a dreadful storm of  
snow, and wind blew <sup>very</sup> high,  
and the snow flew and  
it was cold. - I spoke from  
the wave. - but one thing I like  
and there was very good atten-  
tion again. - went to bed  
soon this evening and had  
a comfortable rest. -

Monday Dec<sup>r</sup> 26. Did not  
get up soon - Some time  
after breakfast I set off for  
Still water, and it was very  
cold, got there before noon  
call'd at M<sup>r</sup>. Andrews, and sat  
a little while, and went off  
and call'd at M<sup>r</sup>. Baker, and  
they all insisted I should and  
preach, and finally I con-  
cited, and with M<sup>rs</sup>. Norton  
and her daughter Lois

Directly after Dinner went  
to Mr. Daniels, and Preach'd  
there to a small Number of  
People - Spoke from xv Kings  
and so on & there was good  
attendance soon after meet-  
ing, I went off in order to go  
over the River - two men wait  
ed for me, but I could not get  
over, there was too much Ice  
and so I turning my course I  
went up to Mr. Powers, a bap-  
tist minister, got there a little  
after Sun-set, and put up  
there, he and his wife receiv'd  
me very kindly.

Tuesday Decr 27 Was at  
Mr. Powers all Day, and  
it was extreme cold, in the  
evening, went to meeting as  
amongst Mr. Powers People &  
there was quite a great many

People for the Cold Season  
& spoke from Psalm 125. 1  
and the People seem to be in-  
different in their attention, their  
bodies were cold and I believe  
Heart too, - after meeting with  
Cuth with Eliza Powers and  
Lodged there again, -

Wednesday Dec<sup>r</sup> 28. Some  
Time after Breakfast, I went  
to M<sup>r</sup> Hallen's meeting House  
to preach, got there about  
12 M<sup>r</sup> Powers went with me  
went into our House just by  
the meeting, was there a few  
minutes and M<sup>r</sup> Hallen came  
in with his wife, and it was  
to late they concluded to meet  
in our Meeting House, and  
we went directly, and there  
was not great many People  
& spoke from 1 Corin<sup>th</sup>, 29.  
and there was good attention

Some were affected, soon after  
meeting I went to about 2 mi  
further to preach amongst Mr  
Powers's People; one Mr. Wright  
carried me in his Sledge, out to  
the House just before Sun set  
about candle lighting went to  
meeting in a school House just  
by, and there was a Crowd of  
People, and I spoke from  
Luke's Lord teach us to pray  
Lady's this night at Mr. Wright's  
and got up late, Mr. Wright &  
I had very agreeable Conversation  
after the rest went to bed, after  
a while I went to bed quietly,  
and had a comfortable rest -

Thursday Dec<sup>r</sup> 29 got up very  
early, and went off. Stopt a few  
minutes at Mr. Chatham's and  
to pass on, and stopt at Mr. Ad  
ley's, and took Breakfast there  
and soon after Mr. Chatham



Came along, and I got up on  
Horse, and went along with him  
and we stopt at M<sup>r</sup> Powers and  
got my things, and took my  
good leave of him and his wife  
and went on again, and Mr  
Coutchane and parted near  
the River, I went up the river  
a little way, and cross'd the River  
and went on, and came to an  
House of one Capt Wright, and  
he desired to go into his House &  
I did, and took Dinner with him  
and he desired me to have meet  
ing at his House, the Sabbath  
following, and I consented, and  
so I part on seeking after my  
Daughter, went to old M<sup>r</sup> Boyles  
and there they told me they were  
gone towards the River, and so I  
learn'd right a bant, and went  
on and I call'd at Hawkins,  
and there I was told, they liv'd  
about a mile & a Quarter,

got them aboard I un. fit, and  
found them all well; thanks  
be to Heaven for his goodness to  
me and to my Daughter,  
Love here, once more —

Friday Dec 30: it was a  
Snowy Day and very cold  
Stays till about 11 and then  
I went of to go to meeting, but  
I could not get Flore to ride  
to Mr. Haskins, for my man  
leaves there and I so I got a  
young man to go for me, Flore  
and he came back soon, and so  
I went of, and call'd on Mr.  
Haskins, and it snow'd very  
hard, and they say'd it was  
most Night, and they <sup>used</sup> never  
me to stay and not long on  
and I comply, and stay  
there all Night and they  
treated me with all kindness  
the woman I had knowledge of

When she was a little girl,  
they had six children four  
Boys and two girls, and they  
agreeable, spent the evening  
with them being agreeable had  
some Exercises with my Notes  
after a while went to bed —

Saturday Dec<sup>r</sup> 31: Some Time  
after Breakfast, I took leave  
of the Family, and went on  
to the River, got on the  
Boat about 11, call on Mr  
Williams, and took Dinner  
there, after Dinner took  
leave of them, and went  
down the River, call on Mr  
M<sup>r</sup> early, a few minutes &  
to pass on, and call on  
Mr Baron and there I  
stop for the Night and was  
kindly entertained —

Sabb Jan<sup>r</sup> 1. 1786. got me up  
some what early, and took  
breakfast, and then after  
after eating, had my horse  
got up, and I took leave of  
the family, and went over  
the River to Capt Writts, and  
at about 11 the People came full  
and at 12 we began the meet-  
ing, and there was considerable  
Number of People, and I spoke  
from Gene

How old he  
after meeting was at Capt Writts  
and intended to stay all Night  
but presently after some time  
a couple of young came to Capt  
Writts, and desired me to go with  
them, and I went, and I carried  
with my Notes, with other things  
and got up late but at last  
I went to bed, —

Monday, Jan<sup>r</sup> 2. got up early  
and went back to Capt Writts

At Lewis Williams, I carried me  
part of the way to the Capt's and  
I got there a boat & was  
expecting to go on my way toward  
Dills Town, - and I was looking  
if any one to help to ward off  
you part of Lumbago. I found so  
and Capt Wright said he would  
come to carry me, and I con-  
cluded to go, and about 10.0. e.  
some of Capt's son, got up a  
stage, and he took, and went  
to good old Deacon Hewitt, a  
Cant. 1. and there I stopt, and  
they concluded to have a meet-  
ing in the evening, and Mr  
White went back - Deacon  
Hewitt was not at home, but his  
son was at home with whom he  
lives - in the evening a number  
of people got together, and I spoke  
to them from Jerem 11. 37. 40 and  
the people were exceedingly atten-

me and Solomon - went to  
see Leon, and had a quiet  
Sleep since more the Lord is  
Draife, Lord enable me to  
live this year as if I knew it  
was the last, that I may live  
to thee in all things, that I may  
confess to my all unto Thee -  
Friday June 5. got up very  
early, and took Breakfast  
with Mr. Kim and Hewel and  
a boat so Mr. Hewel took me  
in his boat, and we went on  
towards the North River, got  
to the River about half after  
11 and we were afraid to go  
over the Bay on the Ice and  
I went over a foot, went to one  
of the Rivers, and tried to find  
Grouse, but I could not get  
any, and so Mr. Hewel went  
back over the River, to fetch  
his Horses, and he soon got

leech, and I got on upon  
one of them and we went  
onto Boughten Hill, and  
we stopt at a house to supper  
of the way, and here we met  
with one Mr. Lake, he had  
a stage going directly to  
the place where I was going  
and he was to have a lot

Tanner's, and seeing that

of Mr. Foster & Mr. Tanner  
and old Mr. Foster being in the  
Stage also, I got to the House  
about 10. and there was a  
great gathering of People  
I began at 1 in the after-  
noon, and there was a  
solemn attention, many were  
greatly affected. - Soon after



I went with M<sup>r</sup> Rose and  
his wife in his Sloop and  
took some Victuals with them  
and soon after eating we  
went to meeting again, we  
met at M<sup>r</sup> Kinnison's and  
there was a goodly number  
of people, and I believe the  
Lord was present with us  
and I believe the Night will  
not be forgot soon, after my  
I went back with M<sup>r</sup> Rose  
in his Sloop, then M<sup>r</sup> Rose came  
from Black Island, I was well  
acquainted with his Brother  
William, I lodged here.

Thursday Jan<sup>y</sup> 5. got up  
very early, and they got  
Breakfast directly, and  
about 9 M<sup>r</sup> Kinnison came  
to M<sup>r</sup> Rose, to go with us &  
we set off soon, in a Sloop

and went back to Saratoga  
got to General's Seat about  
11. and went on to Fish Creek  
got to Mr. Hewitt's about 12. &  
we stayed a little while and  
we returned back to General  
Schiller's Seat, got there about  
2. The men that brought  
stayed a while and then went  
off and I stayed at Mr. Tom  
in one of General's Schiller's  
houses and had a meeting  
there in the evening, but  
there was a small compa-  
ny, and they attended well  
they were chiefly Dutch  
People, and they attended  
well, - after meeting some  
time I had some conversation with  
my Notes, in the Family,  
and it was a solemn

Time, the poor Negroes  
were surpris'd with the  
Texts they chose, some  
Time in the Evening I  
went to bed quietly and  
had a comfortable rest -  
Sunday Jan<sup>r</sup> 6 we got  
up very early, got break  
fast, and a little after Sun  
rise, a Stag and Horses were  
ready to carry me down toward  
the Still Water, and, the general  
Boss order'd one of the gener  
Negroes to carry me, Boss  
in English is Overseer,  
we had a fine Squad of Horses  
we got to Mr Williams, in  
about an Hour, 3 miles &  
half, the Negroes return'd  
right back, and I staid  
a little while, and I took  
my Shank more, and got

of a tent where I had some  
leave of M<sup>r</sup> Williams and  
his Family, and went on  
towards Pitts Town, stop a  
while at Capt Wrights and  
M<sup>r</sup> Wright would get me  
Dinner, and as soon as I  
had done eating, I went on  
again, travel thro Woods  
the biggest part of the way,  
towards Night, I mist my  
way, and was obliged to go  
back, about half a mile  
and call at an House, the  
man was a Black Smith  
his Name is  
and they were quite will  
ing to let me stay, and  
the man and I lodg'd toge  
ther, and I had quite a  
comfortable Night Rest

Saturday Morning got up  
very early, and my wife  
was got up and I went on  
before Sun rise, and I got  
to one Colo<sup>t</sup> Comyon's about  
9, and he knew me, and re-  
ceived kindly, and took to  
them, and was there some  
Time after eating, I took  
my old man, and went to  
M<sup>r</sup> John Lumb's, and was  
kindly received, and there  
I stay'd and Lodg'd there  
and found the Couple very  
agreeable, both of them are  
Christians, I believe in truth  
they are youngerly Couple  
they are of the Baptists  
Sabb<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>ry</sup> 8 Some Time  
about 10 we went to meet  
ing at the House of one  
M<sup>r</sup>

a hour 11. We went to meet  
and the people began to  
gather thick about 12. We  
began the Divine service  
and there was a great number  
of people, one half could not  
come into the Church, and  
I was obliged to stand at the  
Door, and it was late, and  
I spoke from Exh. V. 14.  
and the people attended with  
great attention, and many  
were deeply affected, and  
there were some of the  
and I believe they will  
not forget the Day long  
earn, - soon after meeting  
I went home with Col  
Tomson in his Stage Mr  
Halsted and his wife went  
with us he is an able pup

clear, took Dinner with  
them, in the evening we  
had a Meeting again and  
there was a great number  
of people again, many  
full of people were obliged  
to go back because there  
was no room for them in the  
House, and it was cold, &  
there was great attention  
again, Lodged at the  
Cafe, and was extremely  
kindly entertained, the Cafe  
and Miss Lady are very  
agreeable people —

Monday Jan<sup>y</sup> 9. after break  
I got up and went to see a  
young man that was sick  
and found him quite poorly  
and was under deep concern  
for his poor soul, gave him  
some Counsel and prayed  
with him and then went

towards the East, Betty <sup>and</sup> I  
a young woman went with  
me, and we got to Mr. Higall's  
at about 12. Where the meeting  
was to be. People began  
to collect soon, and there  
was not so great many  
people, and I spoke to  
them from Luke VII 23:  
and the people were very  
much affected many of the

Soon after meeting I went

Wednesday Jan<sup>ry</sup> 11 got up  
early and took breakfast  
and a while after my  
man and horse brought and I  
took leave of the family and  
took of some but not gone more  
than 60 rods before I met a

and we got of my man

in fact, it was about 8 mi  
we had to go, and got to the  
Place about 12 I put up  
Mr. Latham, and about  
in the afternoon we went

went to see Mr<sup>r</sup> Burnham  
she was lately taken with  
a fit, and she is long sick  
I prayed with her, and then  
went on to the meeting  
got there about 12. Stopt a  
while at a Tavern, and  
we went to the House of god  
and it was Extreme Cold, there  
was not a great many People  
and I spoke from Psal. 32:1  
after service went to the same  
House where I stopt to take din  
and directly after Dinner  
I went on towards Bovingdon



Mr. Amos Thierwaugh, went  
with me a little way, and  
we parted, I got to Mr. Swifts  
a little after sunset, and  
was very kindly received &  
he insisted upon it that  
I should keep Sabbath with  
him, and concluded to stay  
Saturday, -

Sabb<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>ry</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> was at the  
Place all Day towards  
Night went to the Printers,  
and coming back I call'd  
on Mr. Robinson an old  
Mother in Israel, and had  
a goodly conversation, a  
bout ten o'clock went back  
to Mr. Swifts and Logans  
there again -

Sabb<sup>th</sup> Jan<sup>ry</sup> 15<sup>th</sup> a Sunday  
after 10 went into the House

and there was a great  
Multitude of People, it is  
a large House and it was  
well filled, - I spoke from  
Luk. XII: 21. and there  
was a serious attention -  
in the afternoon. Spoke from  
1 Corin. XVI: 22. and I believe  
the Power of God accompanied  
the Word there was a great  
shower of Tears, and I  
think they will not soon for-  
get the Day, - after service  
went to Mr. Swifts, took Din  
and directly after eating  
went on to General M. Potts  
took me in his Stage, then  
Potts went from Rhode Is-  
land some years back  
and I have been in his  
House before when he

lived half of Sea Brook  
got to his House about Sun  
Day, and was kindly entertain'd  
by Mrs. Lucille. —

Monday Jan<sup>ry</sup> 16: Got up  
very early, and about 12  
the People began to collect  
there was a large Congrega-  
tion and I spoke to them from  
Roam VIII. and there was a  
good attendance of People and  
they attend well, but I had not  
much freedom. as soon as the  
meeting was over, I went in  
a Stage to Esq<sup>r</sup> Gavel, and  
preach'd there in the evening,  
and there was a great Num-  
ber of People, and I spoke  
to them from 1 John V: 10 and  
I had but a little sense of the  
word, yet there was good

attention, - Lodged there, -  
Tuesday Jan<sup>y</sup> 17. went on my  
way, soon after breakfast  
went thro' Williams town &  
Lainborough. got to Pitts  
Field in the evening and  
Lodged at <sup>Mr. Ingersoll</sup> Ingersoll's a Pub  
with House, and found him &  
his wife very agreeable -

Wednesday Jan<sup>y</sup> 18. got off  
after breakfast, and it was  
Extream cold, Stopt a little  
at Brother David Fowler's in  
Richmond they were all well  
in the after Noon some time  
I passed on, got to M<sup>r</sup>. Sijant's after  
Sun set and Lodged there, -

Thursday Jan<sup>y</sup> 19, it was  
some what pleasant Day

Went about 10. Call on Capt  
Hoke, and they were well.  
But most of the Indians were  
much-sick, so I went a little  
while and to pasture, - got to  
Mr Hecock's in Sheffield in  
Towson, and lodged there.

Friday Jan<sup>y</sup> 20. I concluded  
to go with a couple of men  
to Hill Dale in Noble Town  
and they had to go a mile or two  
to Iron works, and they were  
gone all Day, about 4 or 5  
O'clock lighting, they returned  
to Mr Hecock's and I went there  
in their place and left  
men at Mr Hecock's, and  
it was about 19 miles we  
had to go, and got there  
and we got to the place at

Mr Jordan's and it was a  
lost midnight, and was  
much fatigued, and went  
to sleep soon, and had a com-  
fortable rest.

Saturday Jan' 21: Was at  
Mr Jordan's all Day, some  
Time after Sun set Mr Jordan  
Carried me in a Sledge to Mr  
Lattin's about a mile, and  
then I Lodged, and was kindly  
ly entertained, he is a rich  
Man, and it was a plea-  
sant evening and it thawed  
all-Night!

Sabb. Jan' 22: about  
the People came pretty thick  
and there was a great num-  
ber of people collected toge-  
ther and I spoke from

From IV 17: and the People  
attended solemnly, soon after  
meeting Mr. Philip Lott took  
me in his Wag and carried  
to a Dutch meeting House  
about 4 miles of we got  
there about sun set, and  
present after we went in  
to the House of god, and there  
was a large number of  
People, and I spoke some  
Acts of soon after we  
Mr. Lott took me again in  
his Wag, and went home  
with him, and at his  
House had Supper by their  
Times, and then I took  
and was extremely well  
received, and rested quiet  
ly once more
