Three or four times before now
about 1 went into the meeting

had in these parts, and I spoke
from Acts VIII: 30. the People attend
at Well, - went with one Mr. Hollister
and in the evening, there a Num-
ber of Neighbors, came in and
my good old Friends Mr. Larkin
and his wife came in also, I was
well acquainted with them on
Long Island, and we were very
glad to see one another, and
of their Children came in also
a Son and Daughter, we had by
young Talk, and we had very
agreeable Exercise with my Law
and we sang and pray'd together
and then I went home with Mr.
Larkin and lodged there and
was extremely well received &
I went to bed late and
slept comfortably -

Wednesday Dec^r 7th after break
fast, Mr. Hollister came to Mr. Larkins
with a Stage to carry to meeting
Mr. Larkins another Daughter
Betsey went with us in the
Stage, & we got the meeting about
10: and the people had not got
together but few, and we stayed
till about 12 and went in to
a School House and there was
pretty good number of People &
I spoke from 1 Peter 1:24 -
and there was great solemnity in
the Assembly, soon after I went
to see Mr. Gavenish Betseys House
and a number of People went
also, and the man desired me to
baptize his Child, the woman
was of Baptist Persuasion, yet
The same hourful Consent, and
after Examination, I got up to
show the Nature of offering a
Child unto god in Baptism &
the woman was much affected

and I proceeded to baptize the
child, - after that, I sat down to
eat with them, soon after, I went
to Mr. Palmer's, and in the
Evening, we again in the Ex
ercise with my Land, there
was a Number of young people
and they behaved well, late in
the evening I went to bed quietly,

Third day Dec^r 9. got up very
early, and Mr. Palmer got ~~up~~
left early and soon after eating
I went of to a meeting North
part of Bull's Town, to preach

with a stay for me, and we went
off directly, and got to Mr

rectly back with my Progeny
Folks; and went directly to
Mr. Trovers, and had a mee-
ing there in the Evening, and

I: 3: and I believe the Lord
was present, I had some sense
of Divine things, and the People
were greatly affected, there
was a flood of Tears, - I Lodged
at the same House -

Friday, Dec^r 9: Some Time
after Breakfast, I went of a

before sun set, and we stayed
there a while, took tea with
them, and soon after tea we
went on, and called on Mr
Clarke, a few minutes and then
we went on to good old Mr North
and then I lodged, he had some
agreeable exercise with my Lord
