

Tuesday June 28 A: 1757

I set out from Montauk for N. England, in order to Pass an Examination there, &c. And Wednesday Morning I set out from Easthampton, with the Revd Mr Pomroy and Wardbrige and others, Down to Northwest, & about 12 o'Clock we went aboard of Mr Dayton, and immediately weighed Anchor, and ^{made} Sailed to the Winds, and taking towards New England Shores, and we got to the Mouth of Sea brook Harbor about 9 at Night, and for Fear of the Flats, we Dropped Anchor at a Distance from Shore and there layed all Night, and in the Morning of the 29 we were a Rise, and weighed Anchor, and Sat to Shore, and Mr Pomroy and the two young Women went a Shore, and I shifted aboard of another Boat

whose owners were one M^r Horton
who came down for the river
from up Country, and was
removing with his family
to Stonington - And he let
me a Shove at Black Point -
and I went to Indian Town -
and found My Friends generally
well - and lived at My Just
Justice that Night - Friday
Morning July 23rd - I set off
from My Justice for Mohegan
and got there at Night to
Mohegan, and found all my
Relatives in good Health &c -
and there kept the Sabbath -
and Monday July 24th, I went
from Mohegan for Lebanon
and got there to M^r Wheelock's
just before Sun. set, and was
very kindly received, and found
them all in good Health - and
after a little conversation,

Mr Wheelock concluded, and appointed
the 12th Inst to be the Day of his
Examination, at his House
and immediately sent and gave
Notice, and Defined the assistance
in the Examination, of 5 Neigh-
bouring Ministers, viz, Mr Solo.
Williams of Lebanon, old Society
and Mr Henry Pomroy of Lebanon
and Mr Nathan Strong of New Conn-
ecticut, and Mr Stephen White of
Windsor, and Mr Sam^l Mosley
of Canada - Tuesday July 12th
Expected the Gentlemen to attend
the Examination, but we were
Disappointed ^{the Day of my Expects} - there, none came,
but the Rev^d Mr Pomroy &
we judge the Weather hinder'd
them, it being wet Day, and
Mr Wheelock and Mr Pomroy
consider'd the Matter, and con-
cluded to send to the Ministers
that Day - to come together on
the next Day, which was the 13th
of July. at the House of the

the Revd M^r Williams, and
accordingly they come together
about one o'clock P.M. - and
there I pass'd an Examination
before the Revd. Messrs. Patmon
Williams Eleazer Wheelock
Benjamin Pomeroy Nathan Crosby
and Stephen White, and they
testified, as to conclude to pro-
ceed, to my ordination hereaf-
ter &c. - And just before ten
I set I went down towards Mohe-
gan, and got so far as Norwich
farm, and tired at the house
of one Isaac Huntington, a
Tavern keeper, - Thursday July
of 14th I ^{went} on my journey and
got to Mohegan about 11 o'clock
A.M., and found my relatives
well in so general, July 15th
my brother and I went down to
London in a canoe, and I tired
there that night, - Saturday
July the 16th I went aboard of one
Savisa Williams of Stoning Town

and he got to Mafons Island
some time in the after noon,
and there I stay'd over the
Sabbath, — Monday July 18th
about 1 in the after noon he
went aboard again, and set
sail, for Fisher Island and got
there some time after sun set,
and Tuesday July 19th he set
sail very early for Long Island
and he sailed all the Day in
the Land, and some time in
the Night he got near by Gardeners
Island, and there he dropt the
chor, and Towed all Night —
Wednesday Morning July 20th he
weighed Anchor and Hoisted sail
and Reced towards Napaug
Harbour, and Reced there about
10 in the Morning ^{then I went a Shore} and then
I went by Land to Montauk, and
I got home about 2 P.M., and
found my Poor Family in Comfort-
able Circumstances, — I will be
to god for his Tender Mercies to us
Amen —

May 17th B: 1759

I set out from Montouch for East
hampton, in order to go over to New
England, with some Expectation of
passing an Ordination there, and
lodg'd at Mr Hedges that Night
Tuesday Morning May 17th we
went down to Northwift, and I
staid here at the House of one
Mr Ebenezer Hedges that Night
and Wednesday May 18th we
went aboard of Mr Baylins, and
cross'd the Sound, and got over a
bout 2 at Night, and we
lodg'd at my Aunt Justices House

Thursday May the 19th we
set out very Early in the Morning
for Wobesau, and got there before
Sun set, at my Mothers, Friday
May the 11 I went from Wobesau
for Lebanon, got there some time
before Sun set, joined Mr Wheelers

Wheelock's Family very Poorly
with the Measles. Especially our
David - [Name].
May the 14th the Socy. Association
met at Mr Wheelock's House, &
Consulted my Case, and Concluded,
~~and~~ ^{and} refer'd my ordination to the
Rev^d Presbytery on Long Island
and accordingly wrote, and re-
fer'd me to the Rev^d Presbytery
on Long Island. -

Wednesday May 17th Returned
to the Island, and kept all
Mokegan and kept the Sabbath
there with Indians. -

Monday May 21 we went
Down to New-London, and tarri-
ed there that Night -
and Tuesday May 22 we
went a Board of Mr Gardener's
Saul, of Isle of White, got the

to the Island after sun set, and
we twice there Two Nights -

Thursday May 17 we went
over to the Fire Place, got there
about 10 o'clock in the after noon,
from there I went to Town, got
there about 3 in the after noon
& John and Assunta's Letter to Mr Swell

Friday May 18 I went home
to Mentank, got there about
noon, and found my poor Family
well, and most of Neighbours
I raise be to god therefore -

after this I heard the Good
Prosperity on Long Island received
the Letter, - and appointed the
29 of August 1759 for my ordina-
tion - and they sent a Text to
me out of 72 Psalm the 9 Verse

They of Swoll in the Wilberforce
Hall bow before him —
and also an Exegesis in the
word. — *tu Illuminatus qui Evan-
gelium Nunquam Radial, Eter-
nare Salutem Obtenere Possit* —
And the appointed Time being come
I appeared before the Rev. Rector
at Easthampton, and pass'd an
Examination, and Thursday Aug
ye 30th in the afternoon the Rev.
Rector proceeded in solemnity
of my ordination, the Rev. M^r
Puell of Easthampton, made the
first Prayer, and preach'd from
Gal. 1. 16. and the Rev. M^r
Brown of Bridghampton Deman-
ded my publick Assent to the
Christian Doctrines and the Arti-
cles of Faith, which I did —

then Immediately proceeded to
Imposition of the Hands - the
Reverend Mr Brown Presided,
made the orationation Prayer;
the Revd Mr Barber of South
Folk gave the Right Hand
of Fellowship; and the Revd
Mr Prime of Huntington gave
the Charge and made the last
Prayer, thus the solemnity End-
ed. *Lauds te Deum*

Montauk Co' ye 9th of Decr 1759

I set out from Montauk for the
old Mans whom the Presbytery was
to visit and Mr Beecher was to be vid.
vid. and got so far as Sebunuck
and preached there and tarried all
Night among the Indians, Tuesday
the 10th of Decr I set out very Early on my
Journey, and got to the old mans
about 10th of Decr, and went directly

to Meeting, Mr. Proson of Bridg Hampt
Preach'd from Rev. 11. 30. and Tack'd
one Mr. Millers where the Presbytery
set - Thursday Morning the Presby
met up, the Ministers Disparfola
Sunt in the Morning, and I went
down to South, and got to Wassick
about 9. I M. heard the Indians
sing lively, Preach'd to them at
Evening, they seem'd to give some
good attention - Friday Oct 12 I
got out from Wassick about Early in
the Morning, home ward, and got to
far as Mr. Browns at Bridg Hampt
and Tarr'd there all Night, and
Saturday Oct 13 about 9 I got out
from there, home ward and got home
little after Sun set, and found
my poor Family in Health
Praise be to God - -

April 1. A. 1760
Went to Smith town where the
Presbytery was to set, and
got to far as Connos Place

that Night, and Tuesday
April the 2. Got out early
in the Morning, and got to
Smith Town about 4 O. C.
P. M. and Wednesday the 3^d
Got at Esq. Philips, and
Thursday about 3 O. C. in the
the Post, they broke up,
and I immediately got out
from thence to Mr. Reeves
at Smith and got there just
about Day light in, and
was kindly received by
Mr. Reeves, and Friday
April the 4. I set out from
thence homeward and got
so far as Mr. Brown's at
Night and there I met with
Mr. Horton and we tarried
there all Night

and Saturday. April the
5 about 9 o'clock in the morning
we took Leave of our a native
and I Home about Ten o'clock
and all well at Home —

April ye 26 A. 1760

A Number of us went from
Montauk in our Whale Boat
for New England, and got
over to London about 3 P.M.
and stopt there till just
before sun set and then

we set out from thence
for Mohegan and got there
about 9 at Night found
no my Relations all well

Sabbath April ye 27 kept the
Sabbath at Mohegan with
the Indians I Preached both
Parts of the Day found nothing
Special among them —

Monday April 27 my wife
and Father Fowler and I
and my little son Aaron
went to Lebanon to see
Mr. Wheelock, and he got
them before night found all
well, and deliver up my
little son Aaron to the good
Mr. Leazer Wheelock to be
brought up by him -

Tuesday April 29 he
returned to Madegan again
and got there before night
and stay'd at Methodist
Night Wednesday April 30
about 9 in the morning we
set out from thence toward
home and got so far as
London and there stay'd at
Capt. Haws's Night

Thursday May 4th I have
sat away from W London
for Home and got no further
than Harbors Mouth and
layd all Night at one Mr
Haires Copper House.

Friday May 5th we sat
till very Early in the morning
from hence we got upon
Montauk shore about 10
in the Morning and found
all well &c

^{May 19th}
June the 25th B: 1760 I preached
at Easthampton.

Saturday May 6th I sail from
Montauk for Westward, and got to far
we Mr Brown and have kept the
Sabbath with Mr Brown and re-
ceived the Ladies Supper of the Lord with
the people of Bridge Hampton

Sunday May 7th Mr Brown &
I went together Westward, and we

we got to Quincy and Lodge at one
M^r Howells that night. and Tuesday
May y^e 26 we set out from there
on horse and got to Smithtown at
night and Lodge with one Justice
Phillips over the River, Wednesday
May y^e 27 we set away from there
about 9 in the morning, and got
to Huntington about 1 in the after
noon, and the people had gone to
meeting, and we went directly to meeting
and heard M^r Reese of South, after
meeting we returned to M^r Paine's where
the Presbytery sat, and Examined two
young Men in order to ordination.
Wednesday finished the examinations
with them, and then immediately went
to the House of God and proceeded to in
the Preliminaries of ^{the} ordination,
M^r Brown Preached the ordination
Sermon, M^r Paine made the ordina-
tion Prayer During the imposition
of hands upon M^r Barrett, and
M^r Brown made the Prayer dur-
ing the Imposition of Hands upon
M^r Smith, and M^r Paine gave y^e
Right hand of Fellowship and y^e
Charge, and M^r Olney made

The Concluding Prayer

Friday evening of 30 the Presby-
tery took up a band in the morning
and the Ministers dispersed imme-
diately. I preached at Huntington
in the afternoon and towards
night I went to after prayer
~~at~~ and prayed at
widow Phillips. and Saturday
morning the 31 I preached at after
prayer from 1st. 13.

Sabbath June of 1 I preached there
there again all day from Exod 5. 14
and Levit 5. 18.

Monday of 2 I returned from after
prayer got to Huntington about 11
A.M. and about 5 in the afternoon
I set out from thence homeward
got to Smithtown just before sun
set and prayed at justice Phillips
at Phillips that night. and
Tuesday June of 3 I preached at
Smithtown began about 10 A.M.
from Rev. 22. 12 and after meet-
ing I went down to Sectanket
and preached there that afternoon
from Matth. 22. 42. prayed at
Mr. Pillsbury that night

Wednesday June 4. Got out
from Mr. Tallmadges about 2 A.M.
and went down to Southwark got
to Mr. Hodges about 12 o.c. and
Tabled them about one Hour and
half, and then set away from home
Eastward and got the Indian Place
just before Sun set, and had a
Short Discourse with them in the
Evening. Thursday June 5. I
gave a word of exhortation to the
Indians, very Early in the morning
and then tabled Ladies of them, and
journeyed Eastward and got so
far as South Hampton, and here
Tabled all Night with me Mr.
Henry Foster, and was very kind
ly Entertained. Friday Morning
June 6. was very Stormy Weather
and set out before Day with
the Southhamptons, and I went
to meeting with the people in the
fore Noon, and heard Mr. White

French from Levit 26. 40. 41. 42.

In the after Noon the Storm moderated, and went on my Journey home land, went to see Mr. Paine and Mr. Brown by the way, and to Rufus, and I got to Easthampton just before Sun set met with Mr. Ruell who had just got home from the Main, brought a Tragical News concerning a young Woman —

I Log's left Mr. Ruell, Saturday June 17th 1780, set away from Easthampton for home, and got to Montauk about 3.0. in the After Noon, and found all well at Home, &c.

Monday - 17th of 1780 I set sail from Montauk with John Harris of N. London, for New-England, and we got a shore at the London Harbor Mouth Sunday morning — and from there I sailed by Land for Mahogany and set sail East after Sun set, and staid all

all my Relations well in general
at Mohican, and stayed there two
Days. Friday Sep^r 14th we set
out from Mohican for Lebanon
got there about 10 o'clock in the
Evening all well as Common at Mr
Wheelocks. And Saturday Sep^r
15th David Fowler accompanied
me to Farmington, and we got
there about 10 o'clock after Sun set
and there we found our Friends
Some from Mohican some from
Nahantick, and some from Grafton
and he held a Meeting at one Sol-
omon's ^{House} ~~House~~. I believe a great
course to them, Sabbath Day Sep^r
16th we met together in the
Evening at the same Place, I preached to them
a gain. Monday Sep^r 17th
we set out from there for
Lebanon, and I got to Mr. Pomeroy's
at Night and I staid there
but David went to Mr. Wheelocks
Tuesday Sep^r 18th I left Mr. Pom-
eroy's ^{Lebanon} ~~Lebanon~~ Sep^r 19th I went to see the Red
River, and he gave me 4 Books and
one Dollar

and went to Mr. Wheelock's, and about
10 o'clock the Indian scholars and I went
down to Mahogan, and got there at Night
Wednesday Sept^r 17th by Service at Mahogan
Thursday we went to New London, and
Friday we Stay'd at N. London. Saturday
we went to Nahantick and Stay'd
there the Sabbath even, and Monday Sept^r
18th we spent the day there. Tuesday we
got out for Mahogan again, and got
there about noon in the after. noon, and
Wednesday and Thursday we spent at
Mahogan, and Friday Sept^r 19th
about 10 o'clock we went a board of Mr.
Cahoon and sail'd down to N. London
and a number of us Laid at Capt.
Shou's, ⁺ and many that came with us
were bewitch'd with strong drink,
Saturday Sept^r 20th a few of us went
over to Nahantick again, and got
there about noon, to the surprize
of my friends, being unexpect'd there
and there all well - &c

Sabbath Day Sept^r 21st we kept
the Sabbath there. Monday we went
back to New London got there
about 9 in the morning and spent
the Day there, and saw the exercises

of Joy in New London an account
of the Victory gained in Canada over
the French, Tarr'd at Capt Shaws
that Night again,

Tuesday Sept^r 23 We set out
from N. L. for Long-Island and sail'd
most all that Day and Night
Toward's Morning we got to Easter
Point and some of us went ashore
~~about~~ about a Board again
and sail'd for Shelter Island
being this Board we sail'd in
to Shelter Island Harbor,
at Night went to House found
nothing but negroes and Indians
but they were very kind
to us. The Indians in
hearing I was on the Island
a number came together to
hear the word of god, I gave
a short Discourse

Thursday September 25
we got up very early in
the morning and a horse
and set sail for Montauk
Arrived there ^{time in} some ~~time~~
Night, found all our friends
well -
