

Monday May 11. 1789. (1789)  
to get. 1789.  
I arrived at Albany, just be-  
fore Night, and I then went to  
see about getting a wagon to  
carry us to Schenectady, but  
got none, Tuesday

Tuesday May 12: got a wagon  
early, and we loaded about  
10. and then set off, and we go  
to Schenectady just before  
Ten o'Clock, and we have now  
lost for had rain most the day  
and I was much bent out, so  
we put our things in Mr John  
Post's house, and then we rode  
We went to Troy soon

Wednesday May 13: about  
7: I attended before a Lecture  
and there was not many  
People, because they had no  
Notice I spoke from, (viz  
7: 29: 30: and the People

ended becomingly, and they  
made me a Collection, and  
it was good for the Times —

Thursday May 14: here at  
the Place all Day —

Friday here at all Day  
as usual —

Saturday May 15: a Boat  
10 lie upon a Bank of a Harbor  
our things, and we went  
over the River, and walked  
up the River a boat 2 miles  
and there we stopt some at  
a certain House, and the man  
of the House gave us a Dinner  
and about 11: the Boat came  
up, and set off. some time  
in the afternoon, and we  
got to King's Tavern, and the  
we Lodge, &

Sabb May 17, set off early  
and we got to Warran.

Bush, at Night and my  
wife and I Lodged at Mr. Wor  
thet's, my good old friend,

Monday May 17. been on again  
early, and reached to Lacon <sup>the</sup>  
and my wife & I lodged at Mr.  
Underly —

Tuesday May 18. Got off again  
early, and we here were  
with Rein at Major Fender's,  
and my wife & I went into the  
House, and we were here by  
Treated her Dinner, and  
we here a little further and  
then lodged at Mr. Harvey's —

Wednesday May 20. got up  
early and got her Breakfast  
and then kept on and  
we got up above fort Plain  
and here made up a fire by  
the side of the river and  
there we spent the Night —

Thursday May 21. got up  
early and got Breakfast

and as soon as we had, ate  
we went on again, and in  
the we got to Conajobang and  
here Lodge a little above Mohan  
Cafte, and we made up a fire  
near the River, near by one  
M<sup>r</sup> John Vantrefor.

Friday May 22. In the afternoon  
after setting we went on again  
and in the evening we got  
a little below Fort Hankamer  
and we made up a fire  
again by the River, and  
there we slept.

Saturday May 23 in the  
morning we went on again  
we made a halt at M<sup>r</sup> Frank  
and after that we went on  
here a white woman took  
our little Sallery, and was  
washed about 3 miles. She  
only four and half year old  
she was much worried.

in the Evening we got Mr  
Tyrants, and the Rev Lodge  
and wife and I in a Hotel  
the West Lodge in the Bant  
Sabb May 24: got up early  
and I went over the River  
and went to Fort Denton and  
there I preached, twice to a  
large number of people, and  
I spoke from Genah III: 8  
and 1 Corin XVI: 22 and the  
people attended with all gra  
vity and solemnity, took my  
Sermon at Mr Tolents and  
as soon as the meeting was  
done I went with Dr Petre  
and there took my and  
as soon as we had done I  
had an Horse got up for me  
and a young man with a  
rather Horse to accompany  
me towards Fort Shiloh  
and we soon set off, and he

at about 4 miles short of  
the fort, and there I got down  
and the young men went back  
with Hoffer, and I walked a  
long about a mile, and found  
Tiber. and I went into a certain  
House, and asked whether I  
could not stay there, and they  
said I might, and so I stayed -  
and the man of the House asked  
me whether I could not give them  
a Discourse, I told them I could,  
and so they sent out beads, &  
Joseph came in directly  
and there was a considerable  
Number of People collected.  
and it is a New Settlement,  
and I spoke from the word,  
he that believeth on the Lord  
of Gods, hath the witness in  
himself - and the People at-  
tended with solemnity - soon after  
the Meeting. I went to bed, and  
rested well.



Sabb. May 31: Preached at  
Brother Town. to not a large  
Congregation, - Spoke from,  
and the People were  
attentive, and were glad to see  
me once more. -

Monday June, 22: This week  
went to Warrens Bush, -

Sabb. June 7: Preached at  
Elder Midge's Meeting House  
in Yanket Hill, Spoke from  
and there was a vast  
Number of People, and attended  
with great attention, -

Tuesday June 9. went to  
Albany Bush, and there  
I preached at a certain  
House. and there was not  
many People, and they attended  
with seriousness - -

Wednesday June 10, was at  
Philadelphia Bush, came home  
last Night, and Lodged at one  
Mr. Shumans, - and about 9  
the People collected together at  
the same House, and I preached  
to them. spoke from  
and the People attended well  
as soon as the meeting was  
over, I with one Mr  
and I lined them, and as soon  
I had ate, I went on to John  
Town. and so on - -

Friday June 12. got to Fort  
Plain. before Noon, put up

at Mr Jonathan Sears, one of  
my good old Friends, found them  
all well; - - Towards Night the  
People collected, and there was  
but few, - and I spoke from

Looked out at the same House  
Saturday June 13. Some Time  
before Noon, set off again, and  
got to German Flat, some  
Time before, and I put up at  
Frank's -

Sabb. June 14 after Break  
fast went over to Fort Dayton  
and there preached in a Dutch  
meeting House, and there was  
a large Number of People, and  
I spoke from

July 1st preached at the Ger-  
man Flat -

August 1st Sabbath Sep 1. and  
Sep 2. the last Sabbath. The Text  
I spoke from

by one man. Sin entered into  
the World & by Jesus Christ the  
Same &c. Understandest thou  
what thou readest. at Day  
- For ever on Week Day, thy heart  
is not right in the Sight of god  
So then every one of us shall give  
an account of himself to god. L

Sep<sup>r</sup> 1, was call by the Major  
Colobrouth to be with them in their  
Training at Chinton, a boat 2  
in the night upon they have all  
collected, and the next came to  
Capt. Suttles, whom I was with  
he accompanied me to the com-  
pany, and a fine appearance  
they made for the first time,  
there was expressed of a hundred  
likely young men, the place  
has been settling only ~~one~~ year  
and an half, - I gave them  
a few words of exhortation, and  
then prayd, and then they ever-  
ed a little while, and then went  
to dinner, they put me in the head  
of the table, and a fine dinner  
we had, in the evening I went  
to Capt. Walling, and there  
was hisly entertained. -  
Sep<sup>r</sup> 2, I went home -

Sep<sup>r</sup> 18: 1759 Friday left home  
and set out for New England, my  
son Andrew accompanied, we got to  
Fort Shiber before Night, and here  
stayed there all Night —

Sep<sup>r</sup> 19 we got up very early  
and set off, and we got to Fort  
Cayton near 12, call'd on M<sup>r</sup>  
Talcutt, and took Dinner, and  
then after eating, my boy went  
back, — two towards Night I  
went out to Log<sup>s</sup> Frank's and  
thence Log<sup>s</sup>, —

Sabb. Sep<sup>r</sup> 20: Preach'd at  
Log<sup>s</sup> Frank's Barn, and there  
was a vast Number of People,  
Log<sup>s</sup> at the Log<sup>s</sup> —

Monday Sep<sup>r</sup> 21: Same Time in  
the morning, I went to M<sup>r</sup> Rowns  
and was there a while, and then  
went back to Fort Hawkes,  
took Dinner with M<sup>r</sup>

Tuesday Night, Sept 22, Phelps but  
too came along, and I got a bear  
in it, and I went a horse, and  
we went down and got to the  
Little Falls, after that we  
went on to go, —

Wednesday Sept 23, got up very  
early and had things carried below  
the falls, and we went on down  
the river, and we got to Cohasset  
and we lodged at a Tavern.  
We found the river exceedingly low  
and very difficult in some places  
to get along, the men here voted  
to get out of the boat being afraid —

Thursday Sept 24, got off very  
early again, and got to Schenectady  
a little before 8 Night, and  
lodged at Mr. Post's —

Friday Sept 25, got up early  
and went to a Carolin House  
where I expected to have a chance  
to see a Wagon, but was disappointed  
and I found once more, and found

in the afternoon a Friend came  
to see me, and he took <sup>me</sup> in his wagon  
and we got to Albany just after  
Sabbath, and I lodged at Mr. Verrill's  
and I went to bed soon.

Saturday Oct 3. Some time  
before Noon I got off a foot again  
Went to Coopersman Station, and  
I met Dr. Vetter, and his Brothers  
and they said they would be  
back soon, and would take  
me in their wagon and just  
before Sun Sat they overtook  
and I went with them, and we  
called at Dr. Vetter's a little while  
and Mr. Jesse Vetter came to his  
House, and it rained much  
before we got home, and then  
I lodged.

Sabbath: as soon as we got our  
breakfast, we went into the  
wagon and to meeting at

To Ketter, about 4 miles, &  
there I Preach'd. Spoke from  
Act. VIII. 21. and the People attended  
well. In the after Noon, we went  
to Mr. Lorroo Tenike, <sup>House</sup> ~~House~~, and  
we had a meeting, and there was  
a large Number of People, and  
I Spoke from Jonah III. 5: and  
the People attended with great  
Attention, and it was a Ruine.  
Day, in the evening Preach'd  
in Mr. Lorroo Tenike, ~~House~~, and  
there was a considerable  
People, and I Spoke from Matt  
1: 21: and the People behaved  
well. Lodg'd at the House they  
were built People, and they were  
very kind to me, and rest well.  
Monday Oct 5: Some Time be-  
fore Noon, I had one Hoop <sup>at</sup> ~~at~~  
me and I went to Mr. Northrup  
and found them being Religious  
about 2, see beyond the station

and there was a great Number  
of People - I was at the same  
Place. -

Friday Oct 5. In the forenoon I  
had some eating, and went to  
Dr Stanton's - and he began  
the meeting about 11. and there  
was a great Number of People  
and I spoke from - in the aft-  
-noon preached again - and  
spoke from - in the  
Evening I went to Mr Stanton's  
and did not expect to have  
any People but there was  
a Number come together &  
had a little meeting, - and  
I was at the same Place  
and Mr Heath -

Wednesday Oct 7. Soon after  
breakfast he went to Mr Tennant's  
about 2 he began the meet-

The meeting and there was  
a great Number of People  
and I spoke from Mark 4. 4  
and the People attended well.  
—

after meeting I went to Mr  
John Towners, and there he  
had a religious meeting, several  
and there was a large number  
of People and I spoke to them  
that will go first to and the  
People were encouraged, it  
was a comfortable meeting, I  
stayed at Mr. Towners house, —

On Friday Oct 8, in the morning  
I went to see a woman that  
had been blind some time,  
and said she heard to see and  
said both her eyes were then  
about closed and took much  
time, and then after Mr. Towners  
stayed at Mr. Towners house.

At Wells at Albany

Tuesday Oct<sup>r</sup> 20. went on again  
not far.

Wednesday Oct<sup>r</sup> 21. went on till  
got near New York.

Thursday Oct<sup>r</sup> 22. a little after  
sun rise we were a shore.  
went directly to find a passage  
to New London and found one  
soon, a sloop going to N London  
towards night I put

my things. and Lodged a Board  
Capt. Follows is Master of per.

Friday, <sup>23</sup> Some Time before  
Noon we set sail, and went  
on the wind in our Favour  
and we sailed all Night.

Saturday Oct<sup>r</sup> 24. We went  
the wind in our favour Consider-  
rable. towards Night the wind  
began to blow hard, and the  
clouds gathered thick and so  
we sought for a Harbour, and  
some Time before Sun-set  
we made a Harbour, against  
Bromford, and there lay  
all Night, and it was a  
Stormy Night. —

Sabb. Oct<sup>r</sup> 25. Some Time in  
the Morning we set sail, the  
wind was right a Head, and we  
were getting out of the Har-

Went it was very fair when  
we got out, wind from West  
a boat on floor one half high  
at Night when we got off  
Went and I went to see some  
Friends - Lodged at Mr Perry's  
a public House; and I set up  
late with two women, conversing  
ing a boat Religious matters  
about 11 I went to Bed, and  
I was taken Strangely in the  
Night with an unusual motion  
but after a while went to sleep  
but did not sleep well -

Monday Oct 26. Got up early  
and it was a stormy Day with  
Rain very hard, and wind blew  
hard all towards Night I went  
over to Groton, called on Capt Lathrop  
a few minutes, and then went  
to Mr Street, send them I took  
food, and they let me have a  
Horse and went to Mr Woodman

44. and there I layd, and have  
been kindly entertained, went to  
bed somewhat late, and soon  
after I got to bed, I began to sweat  
again very much and had an  
uncomfortable sleep but poorly.  
Tuesday Oct<sup>r</sup> 27. got up early  
and after breakfast, I rode on  
horse of M<sup>r</sup> Woodmanly, and I  
went to M<sup>r</sup> Saunders, and I met  
M<sup>r</sup> Saunders, and M<sup>r</sup> Woodwork  
and they glad to see me, and  
I slept on, and when I got to the  
house, how glad they were, and  
there I staid all day - I expect  
or may move, that I left with  
M<sup>r</sup> Culver but the bear vid  
a very soft Sable, and was very  
relaxed, and went to I staid all  
and all Night.

Wednesday 28. after breakfast  
took leave of the family, and  
went on my way - in the evening  
I had some a very good sleep.

went to seek Fulcrum, and by  
the way I met Mr. Culver bring  
my horse to me, and so got up  
and went on my horse, and soon  
got to Capt. Plooy's, and the wind  
was very hard, and could not get  
over, and so stayed all Day at  
evening the wind was still very  
strong and I was glad to get  
to stay all Night, and in the even-  
ing the people of the Family asked  
me, whether it would be agree-  
able to me to have a few Neighbors  
come together, that I might pray  
with them, I told them it was  
quite agreeable,

Thursday Oct<sup>r</sup> 29 got up  
early, and took Breakfast and  
then went over - and got to  
see Bracon's some time before  
noon, and found him sick, &  
had been very sick, for he  
had 6. weeks, and was now  
very weak & put,

a little better, and I went  
on to my old House, and  
there that live in my House  
were well, except the woman  
and there I stayed - and I was  
poorly with the common  
cold that is every where -

Sabb<sup>o</sup> Nov<sup>r</sup>: was very warm  
and I felt a little safer, and  
I went to school expecting to  
be a meeting, but he had gone  
and to night back -

<sup>Nov<sup>r</sup></sup> I had much poverty  
yet I went to school & in  
got there after ten o'clock, and  
then was with great joy  
in the evening we had a little  
meeting.

Sabb<sup>o</sup> <sup>Nov<sup>r</sup></sup> the People got  
together about 10, and a great  
number then here, and I sp<sup>oke</sup>  
from Mat 1. 21: and Acts VIII 21  
and the People attended with  
great attention and many  
were <sup>in the</sup> <sup>meeting</sup> - in the evening  
we had a meeting.

10  
Went to Mr. Sturges, and then  
another meeting, and a great  
many people there - I spoke  
from Gal. N. 11 and the people  
seem'd very serious - I sang at  
the same House

Sept 15. went to Mr. Shalley and  
preach'd to a great number of  
people at Spots from Gal. N. 11  
and the people gave very great  
attention, - as soon as the meet-  
ing was over I went to view  
the site and see how conve-  
nient. Number of people, and  
then attended well, and as soon  
as the meeting was done, I went  
home to my old House -

Sept 22. was to go away  
to Rowentham, but it was  
very stormy, and kept about  
10 of the storm abated some, and  
I got off at about 12  
and like the service as usual  
and then home to the same  
at 11

and the People attended with great  
Solemnity - and the People desired  
to have another meeting in the evening  
and to see him another and that  
more People in the evening  
than in the Day Time, and spoke  
from 1 Cor. VII. 29, 30, and those  
were of greater attention than in the  
Day Time. - I lodged at the house  
the Man's Name was M<sup>r</sup> Nicholas  
and was humanely treated. -

Monday Nov<sup>r</sup> 23 after Prayers  
I went to the River on Horse Back  
and the Wind blew very hard,  
but I had a fine Chance, in a  
Whale Boat, to get over the River  
got home about 10, and directly  
went to the People, that were  
waiting over Land. -

Thursday Nov<sup>r</sup> 26. was to go over  
to M<sup>r</sup> Babcock's at Groton  
but it was a very bad Storm.

Saturday Nov<sup>r</sup> 28. Town  
Night. I went to Mr Post's at  
Wesons Hill, in Norway, got  
home at ten o'clock, called at  
Mr John Post's and took sup-  
per there, and after that  
went to old Mr Post's, and  
found him very poorly, and  
thou I lodged, and he had  
several fits in the Night.

Sunday Nov<sup>r</sup> 29. The People  
began to get together about  
10 and there was a large con-  
course of People we began  
the service about 11 and  
broke from Jeru 1:12 and the  
People attended with great  
solemnity, and many were affec-  
ted to tears. soon after we  
of the dinner, I returned home  
and had my meeting at my

own House and there was a  
great many People, and I  
Lapt. June 11. Time 3: —

Jan 10 I have been to no meet-  
ings for Sabbath, we had  
one very bad Stormy Night and  
my Mind has been filled with  
Trouble so that I have had no  
peace, but sorrow, grief and  
Confusion of Heart, and I am  
yet in great Trouble, —

(Thursday was the first  
day of the year, if a  
common year: day 76, 77  
or Wednesday, if leap year:  
day 172. — Feb. 1761
