Monday Evening the next day was a Collection for me
at their Meeting House, and it amounted to 13. 3. 0

And Recommendations are sent by the most distinguished
of this Place, not only to the General, but to other parts
of their Acquaintance, from this City to the furthest West
English Settlements - the People are unconsciously kind
to me in this great City - but are best with our
- Indian Wills and all - I am invited to
the City Every Day to dine with some gentlemen
or others, some times two or three Quarters at once
Especially the Ministers of all sects and Denominations
are extremely kind to me, my yesterday, I went to the
to breakfast with Mr. Thayer, Mr. Postwick and four
in number in Chief in the Province of New York, and I wish
me good success and gave me advice and comfort.
