

Norwich March 6 1774

I received your kind favour last
Sabbath by John at Boston New Town, but
about 2 Weeks Conversation with him, he told
me nothing of the affair you hinted at, - I was
wrote nothing of the Content of yours to say
The other I have sent to Boston some time ago
and English Gentleman calls on me last week
and says with a one Night and stay's not
one Day, he is just from Sir William, and at
quays this Winter past, he tells me, that in
that one I suppose he was at Kestons, now
I have one half at home and one at home
and one at home - The Gentleman, the house is now
I have, he has a Coach of 6 at New York and
2 or 3 servants there, and 2 or 3 with him, he is
very particular about the manner, and what part
went they that with from the whole Royal -
I have no more to say, or I should have come up
to see you, - We are well these things I am
I am most kind Sir

kindness in the family
