Your Allowance for your School  
Masters at Abington Indians, is very small, as they  
had 10 times, but ever under labor it must not justify  
to give by it - Our School Master has 20. of money  
Haupt to live in, a boat 16 shaves of good Land to  
cultivate, he has received it all, and is attend to buy  
two cows and a horse to run in our Common Pasture  
and three horses and a Mowing Cutty as he has a mind  
and good to have 100. for, who get the quantity (perhaps  
1/2 acre) he has an good 30. for it - I have paid him  
6. both in one year, and he has a horse 2. and a cow 1.  
it, I don't think will answer him one day from his  
School, if he had better encouragement, of the  
Indians, with some more his power, he may keep your  
School 3 Months, and if you can agree with him to  
keep it longer after words, I don't say anything against  
it - he is well qualified to keep School among the  
Indians, I am Dear Sir
