on my way, and many hundred Indians & boys

might have stayed by the way, looking to  
that day, but I thought with none, and on  
Thursday a fine day I went home & reached  
home found that the children & I found  
my family in great state of health, and  
the same good state for our well to this time, and  
it is a time of health in our place, - my hope  
is continue as there as ever, I expect a good  
company of Indians this week from several  
tribes, - I visited on the 15th, the week  
before last, at Fisher Island, and he appears  
very friendly to me - I have four times  
of taking it now, to visit Indians in the  
winter and this fall, if my health will permit  
the Lord support you in your great afflictions and  
I'll be glad to hear of your eternal good, - and I'll  
and remember your great kindness here and mine

and around you a thousand fold in Eternal  
rewards - I want much to hear from you  
son and Phillis, - I hope in God, we shall meet  
in a better World than this, where with I am sure  
you shall prosper (hope) - I return you my  
most kindest and sincere thanks for all the trouble  
you have taken and pains upon me and mine  
Please to remember me to Dr. Mitchell and your  
Dear Sister Rachel, to your other Sister to Lady and  
to the other Misses and Servants - My wife and I  
are in health and comfort to you - Your most kind
