

I have this day commenced to keep a journal of my personal history with a view chiefly to my growth in grace. bearly a year has elapsed since I was ordaned & installed the Pasta of the little church in Lancaster; and what have I done for the glory of God, the edification of his people or the conversion of services, Unfaith. fulnes, unfaith fulness much be written upon my very best · efforts. Great God give me more largely of the Spirit of they grace! My mind, this day, has been much concerned for the spiritual welfare of my little flock. Some of them manifest the Spirit of the gospil, but others are cold and lifelits and seem to take no sort of interest in sternal things . The Lord, severe thy work of a reviewing my labours, I am quite satisfied and I hust, am hundred that my Bible clap has been conducted too much with a view to the head and too little with a view to the heart- it has too much cuticism and too little personal application. This morning has been set apart for secret fasting & prayer - I have lately been terribly beset with the dark and horrible suggestions of the great advenary of sonts. Blas phenous and awful words would be shot through my mend with the rapidity of lightening When I would engage in secret prayer at night or undertake to meditate on the semptions or to read them. This day, then far, has been a day of terrible gloom to me - My soul has been or thick darkneps - I have had no enjoyment of god - my heart has been cold and cheer hip and seems atterly incapath of realizing eternal things. I have been reviewing my pack life and am almost drever to respan at the recollection of my sins. My heart seems to be nothing but a sink of corruption - a schenna of muguity. all my services have been selfest. My frames abuch used to be pleasant - were, I fear, attenty distute of spirituality - I am exceedingly hours to love holing and hate sin - but I fear that it is a mere selfish Drive. I have been oppreped with a heavy sense of vilences and simplify-I see an immense amount of corruption in my heart - Self and sensuality together with the direct buffettings of Latan continue to distuit my mind and to distroy my peace. I do long for perfect puntybut I some times suspect that my devices for holimp are more for its results than chelf. The Lord have mercy upon me .- Lead me in the paths of that and punty ! I had be ascribed all the glory. as a mulancholy proof of my shareful deprainty and base ingrah itude I must record the constant suggestions of self-gratulation which I felt on my return home. My heart, in the plenter of its wicherup, was ascubing to me some portion I that florg which belongs only to god. I do abhor self-siking and yet I am continually indulying it. It seems to An that I am full of conharce tows. I enjoyed , however, more real satisfaction in spiritual meditations and employments yerterday than I have done for a long time. Oh that I were fue from kin! Ree? a letter from mother today informing me of my brother's illnip. He is young and promising, but I am awfully apaid, he is without Christ. Oh Lod bring him to a knowle go of himself and of the dear Redeemen. July 30. For the last two or three days I have been much sugaged in reading close norths on experimental rubyion. Boston on the Covenant of grace is a humanous exposition of that wonderful hansaction; I ful my mind established in the great truths of the gospil; but my heart does not take that dup and abiding ment in them which I earnesty this and which their importance defend demard. I have floomy and dishacting doubte of my own personal acceptance. But my heart has been cold and Stupid. I have had no clear news of any spiritual object. My understanding apents; but my fulings are dead. There were a few in the Congregation who have been sectors for some time that manifestly feet the buth with considerable power. Besides these I know of no others who appear to have been awakened. During this whole meeting my heart was in a wretched state. I was fearfully apaulted with The hombh and blasphemous suggestions of Sature, and the power of unbilief seems to have been exerted to an unworked estent. Lince that time I have paped through various orcepitudes of hope and year, but have not attained a chear and abiding apurance of my interest in Christ. My heart is desperately wicked and I am to enslaved with a ligal spirit that I cannot realize the freeness of Divine grace. Oh Lord, take away my unbilief and give me a spirit of undoubting faith! I have been very much hurt this evening, having heard that I had offended some of the methodists of this billage by some rough and unchristian expreptions about thouting. I was wrong in saying what I did - I sensed and sinned privously and shall, by the permission of God, make an acknowledgment tomorrow. My tongue is an unruly member - and I often say under the officer co of orestiment what I am corry for immediately afternario. May the Lord give me purchase? My fulingo, an afraid, are too strongly set against The peculiarchies of arminians. There is more of the flish than the spirt in shem. The truth is, I see nothing about myself that is night - I am allog then a sense. but bliped be god for free grace! That is my only Lope.

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
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
